The London Dispatch was a political journal started by Henry Hetherington. It published articles and letters pertaining to universal suffrage, social equality, child labor, the views of Robert Owen, trade-unionism, co-operation, and issues of interest to the working classes.

Margaret’s name did not appear with the articles. That she wrote them was revealed in *The Evansville Daily Journal*, March 7, 1883, after her death. That information was, no doubt, provided by John Chappellsmith.
