Abstract: This collection consists of a description of the community.

Historical Notes: Tekiah Community, previously known as the Institute for Sustainable Living, was founded in 1990 or 1991. In 1995, the community lost members and essentially found itself starting over. It merged with Abundant Dawn, an existing community located at Floyd, Virginia, that was largely made up of former members of Twin Oaks. Tekiah was one of two "pods" in the larger Abundant Dawn community and practiced income sharing. It reported four members in 2004; it closed in 2005.
