Historical Notes: Community conferences at Twin Oaks have sometimes led to the foundation of new communities. Such was the case with Grey Gables, founded in Louisa County, Virginia, Near Twin Oaks, after a conference in 1973. Grey Gables occupied a 117-acre farm with an old house.
