Abstract: This collection consists of a newspaper article from 1992 and one brochure.

Historical Notes: Established in 1988, Du-Ma is a communal household in Eugene, Oregon, that seeks "to be of service to others as an inspirational model of living and working together to create community and social change." Member eat meals together but have separate incomes, all contributing to common expenses and sharing work. The name of community means "home" in the language of the Kayapula Indian tribe, which is native to the area.
