**Abstract:** This collection consists of newsletters and general information.

**Historical Notes:** In 1957, a group of Mennonites, led by John Miller, a Goshen College faculty member, purchased a house at 727 Reba Place in Evanston, Illinois. They established an intentional Christian community that sought to ameliorate urban social problems. Gradually, they added more houses, eventually encompassing about 150 members in the Reba Place neighborhood, although number have more recently declined. Many members work at outside jobs and contribute their earnings to the common treasury.
