**Abstract:** The Alice Hottenstein Collection consists of prints and other items about art from 1889 to 1954.

**Historical Notes:** Born in 1920, Alice Douglas Hottenstein was the owner of the American Sampler. She was actively involved with the National Society of the Daughters of the Revolution, National Society of the Colonial Dames, Reitz Home Museum, Raintree Quilters Guild, Sinawik Club, and PEO. She and to her husband Carl had two daughters, Jill and Jan. Hottenstein passed away on December 8, 2002. The items in box two are “a series of pen and pencil sketches of the lives of more than 200 of the most prominent personages in history.” This was a subscription only publication sold by Selmar Hess publishers in New York.
