Historical Notes: The Brethren, also known as the German Baptist Brethren, Dunkers, and Dunkards, had their origins among the Pietist dissenters from the German state church; they trace their founding to 1708 in Germany, and, amid persecution and economic difficulties, many soon emigrated to America. In their theology and ecclesiology, they resemble the various groups of Anabaptists (Mennonites, Amish, Hutterites).
