Darling I really was glad to see those letters here from you and mother when I got back. I had three from you waiting here. Your picture was also here. It really is good too, especially that sweet smile on your face. It is a lot different than a couple nights I seen you back there. Ha! Ha! Honey it seems like you are still worrying about that one thing. Well I tell you you sure don't have to worry about that and that is for sure.

Ann did you tell me you sent me some of those pictures you took at the wedding? If you did why they weren't here but the other letters were here. You know the one you wrote when you

Didn't hear from me for so long and you thought I quit writing. Ha! Ha! I suppose you were waiting quite some time for one when I was on my way home. It took me about that long to get back too.

I think I will have to stop for tonight as most of the guys are ready to go to bed and I will have to get the lights out. Will finish tomorrow as this won't go out any sooner anyway.

This is Sunday morning so will finish this. I won't get to church this morning as we haven't a priest here on the post and we have to go in town but we are all quarantined in here for the time being and don't have a chance to get out. It seems like you are getting too good all of a sudden going so often. Ha! Ha! I went almost every day on the boat coming over as I didn't have a thing to do but lay around and that sure gets tiresome on the water.

You were off work quite sometime with that cold. Sure did hate to hear

Jim being down with it. I was sure
lucky being back there where it was
so cold and never getting sick. I thought
maybe that last day I come back there
I might catch a cold but suppose I am
too tough. Ha! Ha! I don't see any reason for
not catching it, do you?

I have your picture setting here on the
window sill but think I will have to
take it down as every time I write a
line I have to look up at it. I'm not
hidding either.

You were saying you wish I would
get back there as instructor someplace.
Well it is just the other way now. I
am instructor over here now. They had
everything changed around over here
when I got back.

Well honey I will stop for now
so this will get out as soon as possible
as I suppose you will be looking for
it. I will try and write tomorrow
again if I'm not too busy. I have it a lot
different than I had it before I left.
