I guess I will never be settled down again as I have been transferred to another island. This time it is a little better as Honolulu is on this island so there is more to do. The other one is the more scenic but I have seen all the scenery I want to see. There are more pineapples growing on this island than you could imagine.

Honolulu is quite a big town but has no tall buildings and Pearl Harbor is really something to see. As you can guess, there are more D's remaining around than anything else but it is that way everywhere now.

The next chance I have I intend to go out to Waikiki beach and see if it is as pretty and romantic as I have always heard.



We really have a perfect set up here and under the present circumstances I couldn't be any better pleased. There isn't anything I can say about the work we are in but it doesn't look like any immediate danger.

I talk to Bill Burns yesterday and will meet him as soon as we can make connections. Its great to be able to see someone from home this far away.

By the way, did you get your birthday present and cablegram yet? I hope it won't take too long as I think you will like it. After I get paid I want to send you a grass shirt, remember you said you wanted one. You will have to put it on for Megan and go into a Hula dance for him.

As for my sending a request, there really isn't a thing I need. Just write as much as you can as that means more than anything else.



The mail still comes in funny but I usually get one or two every day or so. It's funny, I get a letter dated the 25<sup>th</sup> one day and the next day I may get one dated the 2<sup>nd</sup> so it keeps me well informed as I get answers to a question before I get the question. (Can you follow me?)

In the future add "Unit #1" to my address as I may get them a little quicker.

You can have your picture made with a Hula girl, with her arms around you and a leg hanging out but I am afraid to get any of those and send them home for fear of Blackmail.
