Dear June,

After calling all over the island, I finally made connections with Paul, who flew over from Maui. That particular day, the unforseen came up and I couldn't get into Honolulu but I got hold of him by phone and met him. He can come over most any time so I am going to try and meet him the 9th of next month.

Paul really looks good and weighs about 200. His outfit is in Saipan but he was fortunate enough not to be with them. You can't plan on a damn thing in the Army but if every thing goes alright maybe I can meet him the 9th.

Today I went on a conducted tour of a sugar cane mill and it was refined. (Joke). It was rather interesting to see how the cane is brought in, in car, and the process they through before the finished product is turned out. The cane stalks are used in the furnaces

to produce the sugar and they even go as far as to send the mud from the cane back to the fields. The irrigation system is something to see and you would have no idea how much water it takes to grow. A crop grows two years before it is ready to be cut and the same plant is good for 3 harvests.

I hope, before long, that I get to go through the Dole Pineapple Plant and see them can pineapples etc.

How come you are going to teach again this year? If I were you I think I would take it easy and rest up for awhile. How is Mung and Mae? By the way has Mung heard any more from Uncle Sam? Well its time for bid again so will close for now. Write the very chance you have
