Received your letter today telling about your fishing trip and looking out. Don't mention eating out or picnics to me as I get sick every time I think about it. After this was if I ever so much as go out to Mieska park or picnicking, I hope some body kicks me in the ---!

Had a good time today down at the beach and the water is sure fine. This is the best climate in the world, never to hot or to cold. I am beginning to disagree with Shuman when he said was is hell.

June I heard one of these Jap propaganda broadcast yesterday and it was really a laugh. To hear them tell it they treat our boys in prison camps with the best of care and they had a soldier to testify. I guess they either had a gun in his back or it

was a Jap impersonation. It sounded
more like the latter was true as you
could notice the errors in his speech
that an American would not make.

They even had a Newscast and
you should have heard that. According
to them we may as well go home.

I guess you are glad to be
through teaching for awhile now.
You and Morgan should take a
vacation and get away from it all
for awhile.

By the way, I am getting
my letters a little more regular
now and hardly a day goes by
that I don't hear from you, Mom
or Emma. That sure helps a
lot.

Well June will close for now
so write when you have the
time. Tell May hello.
