Last Sunday, I went in town for the day and saw a good football that afternoon. I took some good pictures of Waikiki and hope they come out good. I have been intending for quite awhile to get some good picture in Waikiki but never did get around to it.

Last Sat., I went in to Hickam

Field to see a baseball game and it sure is a nice place. In telling you I sure am lucky to be on this island as I couldn't find any more to do in a camp back in the states.

Well, my watch has gone bad and I think I will send it home. It is to good a watch to be used the way it is here in the army. I can get one of these waterproof watches here for \$20 so I think I will buy one of them. I can get it through a P.X which is cheaper than buying it in town.

I was sorry to hear that John Crawford is in the infantry as they are the boys who really go through hell. Anyway, I hope he doesn't have to go overseas with them as he might see quite a bit of action.

Last night I was looking over some maps of the world and planning the way I would like to come home. That will really be the day, if it ever does arrive. I sure wish I could have gone to England as I might have gone all the way around the world.

Anyway I will be satisfied just getting home.
