*from the President's Desk*

Your Alumni Association is now a member of the American Alumni Council. The Council is designed to keep the Alumni Association up with current aspects of Alumni Affairs. The AAC offers such services to us as a critiquing service which enables us to submit alumni periodicals and direct mail pieces for expert criticism. Also, the council operates a lending library through which members may borrow material (at no cost) on any and all phases of the Council's work. The AAC offers other services such as publications, career services, and conferences to keep our alumni association current.

From a survey taken by the Alumni Association, of which 26% of questionnaires returned, results showed 37% of ISUE graduates are currently enrolled in graduate school, with no one having complete degree requirements in graduate school. Students are studying in areas of business, education, and science.

The survey also showed that ISUE graduates are employed in fields of teaching, accounting, management, personnel, publicity and public relations, and sales. Some graduates are serving the military. Graduates are also involved in community affairs. As records indicate, graduates are active in Jaycee Chapters, American Civil Liberties Union, legislative committees, Young Republicans, Tri-State Adjuster Association, and local chambers of commerce.

The Office of Admissions has noted the growth of the ISUE Alumni Association and the increasing involvement of alumni in University affairs. It appears that the time has come to begin involving our alumni in the recruiting process. We hope that the alumni can provide a new avenue of input into our recruiting activities.

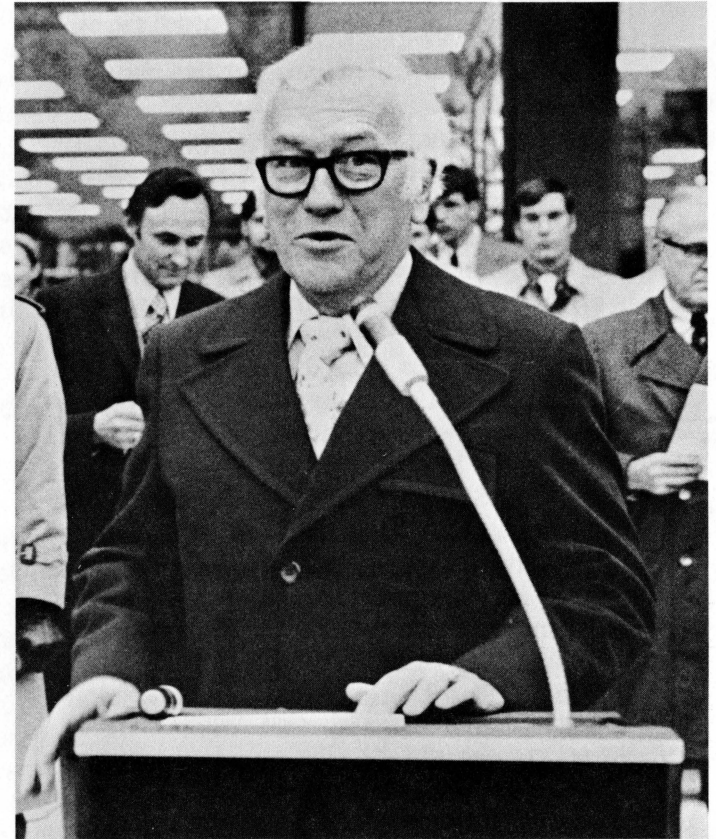

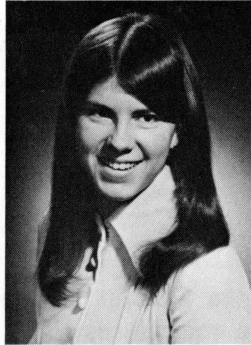

# Fritz Boosts Foundation Fund

A significant grant of \$60,000 has been given to the ISUE Foundation by Mr. and Mrs. Ed Fritz, 201 Fernwood Drive. Mr. Fritz and his firm, the Chayse-Virginia Corporation (named Virginia Corporation after Mr. Fritz's wife's first name), the second largest manufacturer of dental chairs in the world, is concerned about dental health care manpower shortages. The Chayse-Virginia Corporation has worked extensively with dental education programs in communities in the states of Kentucky, Tennessee, Florida, and Illinois. Mr. Fritz has become acutely aware of the unmet dental health care for large sectors of our population. Because of an awareness of the dental health care manpower needs and the efforts to establish programs in other states and areas, Mr. and Mrs. Fritz felt it desirable to make a contribution to encourage dental education development at ISUE to meet the needs of Southwestern Indiana.

Dean Ralph McDonald of the Indiana University School of Dentistry explained that there is a serious dental manpower shortage in Indiana and that by the joint efforts of the Evansville campus and community and the Indiana University School of Dentistry, significant strides could be made in the years ahead in alleviating the dental manpower shortage and attracting minority students and students from rural areas into the program who would then return to those areas where the critical manpower shortages exist.

Mr. Fritz, in cooperation with the First District Dental Society Advisory Committee to the Evansville Campus Dental Auxiliary Program, provided much of the stimulation to initiate the present dental auxiliary education programs on the ISUE campus. An important component of the ISUE campus instructional program in dental hygiene is the operation of a dental hygiene clinic which provides dental hygiene care which hygienists can perform as an instructionally related community service. The dental programs now offered at ISUE are offered in co-operation with the Indiana University School of Dentistry.

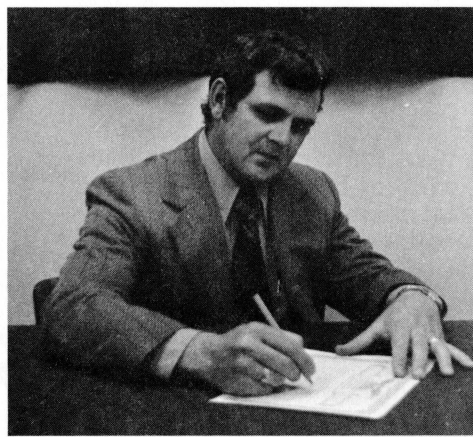
## Featuring The Faculty

# Baseball Begins for Eagles

With the opening of a new baseball season comes the opening of a new ballpark and a tough schedule for the ISUE Eagles.

The new park is a pitchers' park with lines extending 310 feet in left and right, 385 feet in the power alleys, and 410 feet in the center. The University of Southern Illinois — Edwardsville is the only other such park.

The success of this season will depend on the strength of the infield, both defensively and offensively. The only returning infield starter from last year's squad is shortstop Don Powers, a .259 hitter. The first base position is to be filled by freshman Don Asay from Evansville North High School. Players in the competition for the second and third base positions include Richard Weber, Edgar Crawley, Terry Baum, Rick Dowden, and Brian Raibley.

The outfield positions will be handled by three two-year lettermen, Gary Russell, Bill Kothe and Tom Schapker. Freshman Kim Wood and Edward Crawley will provide adequate relief in these positions if needed.

The catching department is in good hands with Dennis Pruiett doing the bulk of the catching and Lennis Titzer providing capable assistance when needed.

Leading the list of returning pitchers for this season is right hander John Warner, 4-1 last year with a 2.00 ERA; lefthander John Besing, 2-4 last year

with a 3.05 ERA; and righthander Ron Romain, 1-5 last year with a 5.14 ERA. New additions to the pitching staff this season are righthander Jim Scheller, former Evansville Memorial High School standout and Rick LeGrange, a righthander from Ft. Branch, Ind.

Four new teams have been added to the Eagles' baseball schedule this spring which include David Lipscomb College from Nashville, Tenn., who have been runnerup to the National champs in NAIA competition the last two years; Indiana Central from the ICC and NAIA District 21 champion last year; Eastern Illinois University; and Southeast Missouri State College.

Other formidable opponents on the schedule again this year will include Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville — third place finisher in the NCAA College Division playoff last year — along with NCAA College Division fourth place finisher University of Missouri-St. Louis, cross town rival University of Evansville, Kentucky Wesleyan, Marian College, Bellarmine College and Nortwood.

In summing up the upcoming season Coach Jim Brown, in his third season at the helm of the baseball Eagles, states that the success of the 1973 baseball season depends on three factors: First, the durability of the small number of pitchers; secondly, the defense of the team as a whole and particularly the inexperienced infield, and lastly, the absence of injuries.
