Twenty men's and 18 women's teams from the Great Lakes Region of NCAA will compete Saturday, November 7, in Division II regional competition being hosted by the University of Southern Indiana at Oak Meadow Golf and Country Club north of Evansville.

The women's teams will compete in a 5,000-meter run that will start at 8:15 a.m. (CST). The men's competition, a 10,000-meter run, will start at 9:30 a.m. Both will be run on the Oak Meadow golf course (see map on back side), where USI also will host the NCAA Division II National Championships on Saturday, November 21.


The USI men's cross country team will compete against teams from Ashland, Bellarmine, Central Missouri State, Ferris State, Grand Valley State, IU/PU-Ft. Wayne, Kentucky State, Lewis, University of Missouri-Rolla, Northeast Missouri State, Northern Kentucky, Northern Michigan, Northwest Missouri State, Oakland College, St. Joseph's, Southeast Missouri State, Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville, Southwest Baptist, and Wayne State.

Women's cross country competition will involve teams from Ashland, Bellarmine, Central Missouri, Ferris, Grand Valley State, University of Indianapolis, IU/PU-Ft. Wayne, Lewis, University of Missouri-Rolla, Northeast Missouri, Northern Kentucky, Northern Michigan, Northwest Missouri, St. Joseph's, Southeast Missouri, SIU-Edwardsville, Southwest Baptist, and University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

Tickets for the events are \$1 for students and \$2 for adults. Spectators must park at the Vanderburgh County 4-H Center, where shuttle buses will be available for the trip to Oak Meadow.
