**ISUE PERFORMS ALL FAITH SEDER SUPPER.**  
The Seder, the traditional Jewish Passover family meal, will be performed for people of all denominations at the ISUE Cafeteria on Thursday, March 27, at 6:30 p.m.

Student coordinator Kathy Stumpf explains that the Seder is a celebration in the Jewish custom of the Hebrew's liberation from slavery in Egypt with many rites and symbols connected with it. At the supper, the symbolic food -- wine, matzo,

parsley, horseradish, haroses, roasted aphikomon -- will be served and explained by Bill Fogle who will conduct the supper. The Seder is not only devotional, it combines serious observations on Jewish life with poetry and light-hearted ditties.

The Seder Supper is a joyful feast which must have children present to be authentic. The ritual foods and prayers will be demonstrated. A game for children is included in the ceremonial aspect. Since it is a family meal, families are encouraged to attend.

The meal will include matzo ball soup, roast chicken and matzo ball dressing, broccoli, fresh vegetables with gefilte fish, fruit cup and macaroons for dessert, and wine.

Sponsoring the Seder Supper is the ISUE Campus Ministry. Reservations may be made by calling the Campus Ministry at extension 1810. The cost for adults is \$5.70 and for children under 12, it is \$2.90.
