3. Course Numbers

The percentage requirement for courses at the 300-400 level cited in the college catalog is not appropriate with existing course numbering and should have been changed prior to printing of the catalog. The 40 percentage upper level requirements are not enforced in teacher education curricular, a 30-70% ratio is used in industrial arts, and the college of arts and sciences uses 34-35 percent 300-400 level courses.

Basically students should meet course requirements of the curricula on which they are enrolled and general education requirements. Other courses can be electives.
