UNUSED SICK LEAVE AT DEATH OR RETIREMENT.

The Indiana State University Board of Trustees has approved a policy which provides for a partial payment of unused sick leave at death or retirement. Effective December 19, 1974, non-exempt, non-academic employees who retire from the University and qualify for a monthly Public Employee's Retirement Fund benefit, will be paid one-half of their unused sick leave up to a maximum of 45 days. This policy will also apply in the event of a non-exempt, non-academic employee regardless of length of service.

CAMPUS ORGANIZATIONS.

PHI BETA CHI, organized in October, 1969, is a student organization whose goals are to provide service to the university and community, and a means by which members may develop social growth, maturity and friendship through sisterhood.

Phi Beta Chi received various awards last year.
