**ISUE 1980 SUMMER NONCREDIT COURSE SELECTIONS.** The athletic, the business-minded, the creative, the adventurous and the studious are among those people who will be interested in ISUE's summer noncredit course offerings.

For the athlete, there will be courses in karate, racquetball, beginning tennis and sailing. For the inquisitive, courses are available that delve into such subjects as small gasoline engines, oriental gourmet cooking, microcomputers, solar energy and how to be an amateur outdoor scientist. Workshop in Clay and Introduction to Drawing are two courses offered for the creative. Other courses offered include Improving Study Skills, Nature Study, Stress: Causes and Coping Strategies, and Assertiveness Training.

Courses designed for children are Amateur Outdoor Scientist, Creative Writing for Children, Children's Art Workshop, Junior Zookeeper and Gymnastics for Girls and Boys. Five summer sports camps will be held this year -- Basketball for Boys, Basketball for Girls, Cheerleading Clinic, Volleyball for Boys and Girls, and Soccer.

Two art and theatre tours to Chicago are planned this summer from June 20 through 22 and August 22 through 24.

**CHICAGO ART AND THEATER TOUR PLANNED.**

The first ISUE Chicago Art and

Theatre tour will include the play "The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas" starring Alexis Smith.

Based on an actual incident, the musical tells how a crusading television personality brings about the closing of a brothel that has been an accepted part of the community for many years.

Optional activities of the tour include a visit to the Museum of Science and Industry, the Field Museum, and the Shedd Aquarium. Shopping is easily accessible in the Loop or Water Tower Place and there are many fine restaurants for dining.

DR. JAMES BLEVINS, chairman of the division of humanities, and SYLVIA NEFF WEINZAPFEL, assistant director of continuing education, will conduct the tour which will leave Friday, June 20 at 8:30 and return Sunday, June 22 at 10:00 p.m.

The \$99 registration fee includes bus fare, box lunch, two nights lodging at the Palmer House (double occupancy), a theatre ticket and transportation to optional activities. The deadline for registration is June 4.
