OPEN ENROLLMENT FOR BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD INSURANCE.

The Blue Cross Blue Shield group insurance program at ISUE provides that once each year, during the month of November, an open enrollment period is made available to all employees who have not previously enrolled either themselves or their dependents. Those who wish to take advantage of this opportunity should visit the Personnel Office. Your coverage will become effective November 10, 1979 if you complete the necessary enrollment card and make a cash payment by Friday, October 26, 1979. The cost is \$7.94 per month for single coverage or \$19.48 per month for family coverage. If you choose to wait and begin payment by payroll deduction, the effective date of your insurance will be December 10, 1979.
