Openings still are available in noncredit summer courses at the University of Southern Indiana designed to help the professional employee sharpen skills in project development and presentation.

The series starts Tuesday, June 7, with "Building and Leading an Effective Project Team," a day-long course to give potential leaders and participants proven tools to develop effective teams. Susan Ellsperman, associate with the Center for Research in Applied Creativity, will be the instructor.

On June 14, James L. Salm, president of Manufacturing Advisory Service, will open a two-day course on "Statistical Process Control," designed to aid engineering, production, quality control, and support personnel in developing SPC programs. The first session will be Tuesday morning, June 14; the second will be all day Tuesday, June 21.

The series will be completed with "Building Technical Writing Skills," a two-day workshop to be presented by Sharon Morrow, special instructor in humanities at USI, on Thursday and Friday, June 23-24.
