



MURAL ARTIST TO SPEAK, Gilbert Wilson, a Franklin County resident noted for his mural paintings, will present a talk at the Indiana State University Evansville Humanities Forum Friday, November 19, 1976. During a 25-year period, Mr. Wilson has also created over 300 depictions of the scenes and characters in Herman Melville's Moby Dick.

A left-handed artist, Mr. Wilson was trained at Teachers College in Terre Haute, the Art Institute of Chicago and the Yale School of Fine Arts, where he was awarded the Beau Arts Medal.

Recognized nationally for his artistic achievements, Wilson has worked with muralist Eugene Savage and studied sculpture with Urbici Soler in San Francisco.

Mr. Wilson will speak at 12:00 noon in Room A34.

MCAUGHTON BICENTENNIAL SCULPTURE INSTALLED, "Flowing River", an 11-1/2 foot Cor-ten steel sculpture conceived by JOHN MCAUGHTON, ISUE Assistant Professor of Art, and built by Evansville Sheet Metal Works, Inc., was installed by Poe Erection Company on Saturday, November 13 at the Evansville Museum as part of the City's continuing Bicentennial celebration.

Chosen by a broadly based citizens' committee chaired by Evansville attorney Ted Ziemer, McNaughton's work was selected from among 18 applications by Indiana artists earlier in the year. Located in the Museum's Sculpture Garden, the new work will have the Ohio River as its backdrop.

The project was supported by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts in Washington, D.C., a federal agency, and the Indiana Arts Commission, a state agency. The Commission provides aid for a wide variety of programs and services in the performing, visual and literary arts, available to community groups and organizations throughout the state.

The Evansville Museum is matching the \$4,000 Arts Commission grant to the Evansville Bicentennial Council with an additional \$4,000 from its own Hilb-Gumberts-Hirsheimer Trust.

BUSINESS SEMINAR SESSIONS CONCLUDE THURSDAY, Dr. Frederick Winter from the University of Illinois will be the featured speaker in the final session of the three-part seminar, Regional Business Opportunities: Looking Beyond Tomorrow, on Thursday, November 18 at Indiana State University Evansville.

One of the nation's leading new product development strategists, Dr. Winter will be discussing areas of future business and economic growth in the region; buying power and retail business development trends; and developing, predicting and monitoring new products. A panel of Evansville men and women will react to Dr. Winter's comments.
