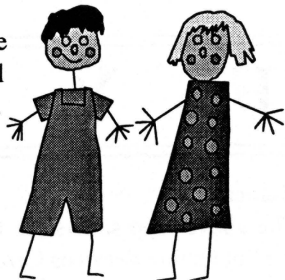




Openings available in Super Summer programs for children and adolescents

The Office of Continuing Education offers multiple one-week Super Summer sessions and special enrichment courses for children of varying ages. Classes are held both on-campus and off-campus in June and July.



Programs available June 15 - 19 at USI include computers: World Wide Web discovery and learning word processing, spreadsheets, and graphic design; experiments in science; home alone instructions and babysitting (diapering included!); art; and discoveries in pre-history.

Programs available July 13 - 17 at Evansville Day School include scientific experiments and "magic" with science; computer applications in Macintosh; public speaking to prepare youngsters for speech teams and drama; and a painting, sculpting, and drawing art class.

The summer also offers a horse lover's clinic June 30 and July 1, or July 21 - 22 at Cedarwood Farms; "Surfin' the Net for Parents and Kids" June 9 and 16 at USI, so that parents can attend the class and learn with their children; and SAT 1 preparations June 13 and 20 at USI.

Instructors are teachers from local school corporations, USI faculty, and other professionals.

Class times and durations vary. Most classes are either morning or afternoon for one week, while the horse clinic is five hours per day for two days and the SAT 1 preparations classes are six hours for one day. Registration fees also vary. For a brochure, call 464-1989.

Discounted ticket prices for University faculty, staff, and students are \$14. Discounted season tickets are \$32. Tickets for children ages 8-18 during a Saturday matinee performance are \$5 by reservation (one child per adult). Call 682-3115 for information or to order tickets.

The bus will leave the home at 5:30 p.m. with one stop at Diamond Avenue and St. Joseph Avenue to accommodate patrons who want to board from that location. The evening includes dinner in New Harmony at Bayou Grill at 6:30 p.m. followed by opening curtain at 8 p.m.

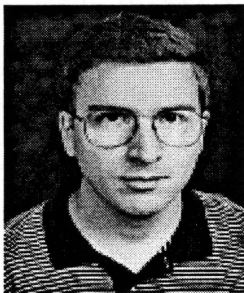

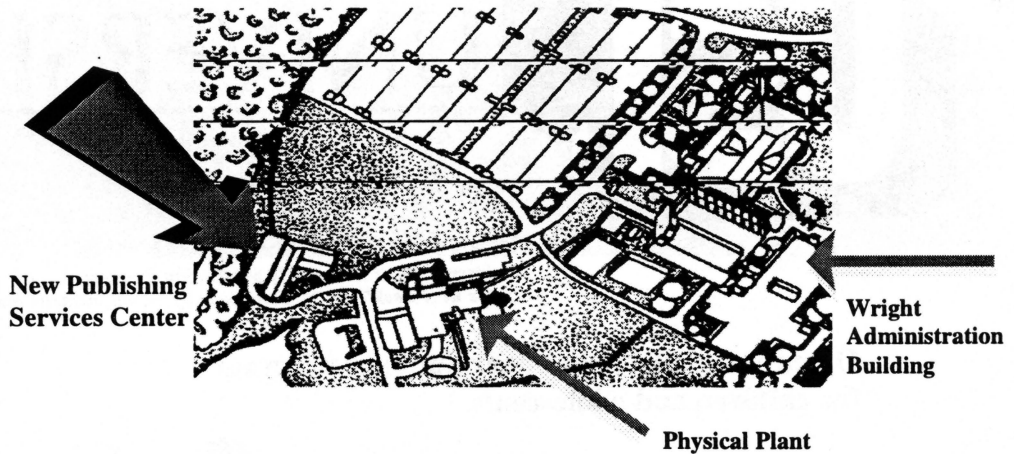
Clary

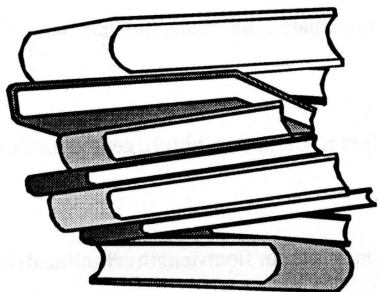

GLVC basketball championship slated in Evansville:

At a June 4 news conference, GLVC Commissioner Carl McAloose announced that the Great Lakes Valley Conference men's and women's basketball post-season tournament for the next three seasons (1999 - 2001) will be played at Roberts Stadium.

The 1999 GLVC Championship will be played Wednesday - Saturday, February 24 - 27 with the conference's top eight squads, both men and women, competing in this unique four-day championship series. This will be the GLVC's second post-season tournament. Kentucky Wesleyan won the men's title and USI captured the women's crown in the league's inaugural tournament last February.

The tournament begins Wednesday February 24, with women's quarter finals at noon, 2:30 p.m., 6 p.m., and 8:30 p.m. The men's quarter finals will be Thursday February 25, at the previous day's game times. Friday February 26, the women's semifinals will be at noon and 2:30 p.m. and the men's at 6 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. On Saturday February 27, the women's championship game will be at 4 p.m. and the men's at 7 p.m.

A special \$20 ticket will be on sale for all 14 games prior to February 1. Other ticket packages and individual prices for games will be raised after February 1. The 14-game tickets will be available November 1.
