New Harmony Gallery art exhibit

The New Harmony Gallery of Contemporary Art will present an exhibition by Mr. David Bower and Mr. Kerri Mehringer May 3 through June 10. A public reception for the artists will be held from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. Saturday, May 2.

Mr. David Bower, professor of art at Northern Illinois University, creates geometric wall sculpture that focuses on form, structure, and the duality of chaos and order.
