The album of our photographic safari covers the time span from August 1986 to May 1987. Our study examines an area called the University of Southern Indiana Campus and its inhabitants. We have documented all major events of this unique and intriguing group. A large section is donated to their social groups and activities with comments from the species.

The senior members are a special sub-species. Toward the end of the year they are commonly referred to as graduates. They go through a particularly mundane ceremony that is documented in the events section.






ORIENTATION

HALLOWEEN MADNESS




"GOODBYE PEOPLE"


arrangements for us to photograph the group during a rehearsal for inclusion in our journal account. The documentation is of the cast in costume.






CHRISTMAS AT NEW HARMONY


MUSICMANIA



The Activities Programming Board puts on a special celebration for the tribal members' children. The party's main feature was an easter egg hunt. The children were visited by clowns and cartoon characters.







GREEK WEEK



Once more they select a reigning royal couple. For this week, God Rob Zigenfus and Goddess Jackie Clark ruled.










EAGLE GRAN PRIX




















MID-AMERICA SINGERS

FUTURE CLASSROOM BUILDING

The new general purpose classroom building, for which \$7.8 million bonding authorization has been sought, will provide classrooms, faculty offices, and centralized student services.


Since 1977, when the last building for the University was authorized by the General Assembly, the enrollment at the University of Southern Indiana has grown steadily, increasing more than 25 percent. This pattern is continuing as the University increases the participation rate of adult students and students previously underserved in southwestern Indiana. Norms used by the Indiana Academic Facilities Advisory Committee would call for 330,000 assignable square feet to accommodate the 1986 fall enrollment at the University of Southern Indiana, but only 242,348 assignable square feet – 74 percent of the requirement – were available. Since 1985, there has been maximum scheduling of available classrooms during peak class times. Additional academic space needs are critical.

In the preliminary design of the new general purpose classroom building, there are 66,800 gross square feet, of which 44,658 are assignable. The building will provide 15 general classrooms, four lecture halls, two microcomputer laboratories, two seminar rooms, one accountancy laboratory, space for faculty offices, and centralized offices for student services. This project also will allow the University of Southern Indiana to replace six unsuitable portable classrooms and to convert four general classrooms in the Science Center to needed science laboratories.

GRADUATION

There is a new organization on campus called Golden Key. Golden Key is a national academic honors organization dedicated to achievement and recognition of scholastic excellence. The Society is interdisciplinary, and unites the talents of the very best undergraduate students, outstanding faculty, and university administrators.

Some of the basic principles by which the Society is distinguished include:

OBJETIVE MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA: Membership is by invitation only and is limited to no more than the top 15% scholastically of the juniors and seniors enrolled at USI. Each chapter has the right to determine the specific grade point requirement. Part-time as well as full-time students qualify: thus, membership is open to both traditional and non-traditional students.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Two scholarships are awarded annually at each chapter to the outstanding junior and senior initiates. Over \$200,000 in scholarship awards have been presented to outstanding Golden Key members through this program.

ANNUAL RECEPTIONS: Receptions are held to honor Golden Key members with the presentation of certificates. They are generally conducted during the fall functions. Fall receptions also provide each member an opportunity to use Golden Key as a reference throughout the year when applying to a graduate school, law program, or for interviewing.

CHAPTER ACTIVITIES: The Chapter plans a vigorous program of service to the USI campus and community. LIFETIME MEMBERSHIP FEE: The one time membership fee is the only economic compensation required of members.

CAREER ASSISTANCE: Corporations recognize that Golden Key members are distinguished nationally for their academic excellence and seek to recruit them. The "Career Assistance Reference," listing these corporations, is featured annually in Golden Key's high quality magazine *CONCEPTS* to provide contact for career opportunities. An article on USI's newly organized Golden Key will be featured in the magazine and also an article by Dr. Dan Scavone. Chapter Adviser of USI's Golden Key, on the Shroud of Turin, will be included.

HISTORY: Golden Key National Honor Society was founded at Georgia State University on November 29, 1977 by a group of outstanding undergraduate students. Since that time Golden Key has established itself as a positive force in higher education. The Society has chartered over 100 chapters from coast to coast, inducted over 100,000 lifetime members and 2,000 honorary members, and awarded over \$200,000 in scholarships. Golden Key is proud to recognize the scholastic achievements of students who otherwise would not have recognition. In this it performs a sorely needed service in the USI campus community.

A reception was held at the University Student Center on April 12th. Ninety-two members were initiated into the new Golden Key Chapter. Chief Justice of the Indiana Supreme Court, Randall T. Shepard, was the Keynote Speaker. The chartering officers are Peggy Stone, President; Linda Leigh, Vice-President for Chapter Activities; Denny Roth, Vice-President for Publicity; Debbie Long, Corresponding Secretary; Bobbie Hendrickson, Recording Secretary; and Historian Kathy Brauer.














President's Medal




recently organized Golden Key National Honor Society at USI.
