Eric L. vonFuhrmann, Assistant Professor of English, has been selected for a Fulbright-Hays award by the Board of Foreign Scholarships and the Department of State. Professor vonFuhrmann will be lecturing at the University of Valencia, Spain, in the field of American studies during the 1974-75 school year. This is the second Fulbright-Hays award he has received, having previously lectured at the University of Sevilla, Spain, in 1970-71.

John M. Barnes, Assistant Professor Geology-Geography, gave a talk to the 5-County Bankers Association Meeting in Carmi, Illinois, on June 19. His talk, given at Two-Tonys, was entitled "Economic and Environmental Effects of Energy Consumption."

Charles Board, Supervisor-Safety and Security, received Red Cross training for instructors at National Aquatic Small Craft and First Aid School located at Purdue's Camp Limberlost in LaGrange, Indiana, on June 1-12. With over 100 hours of instruction from the Red Cross course, prepared by Bell Telephone, Mr. Board received four teaching certificates in basic, multi media, standard and advanced first aid.

Another area in which Mr. Board will soon be receiving his fifth certificate in is from the American Heart Association in cardio pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and emergency cardiac care. CPR simplified means heart massage and artificial respiration done simultaneously. This course will be taught to all security officers on campus. Also, in the near future, first aid classes will become available for maintenance, custodial and grounds employees.
