**1975 COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES.** The 1975 Commencement Exercises of ISUE will be held on Thursday, May 8, 1975 at the Vanderburgh County Civic Auditorium beginning at 6:00 p.m. Over 400 students have completed degree requirements for the associate and baccalaureate degrees. Alan C. Rankin, President of Indiana State University, who is retiring as president with the close of the academic year, will give the Commencement address. David L. Rice, President of the Evansville Campus, will preside at the ceremony.

Three Evansville men along with Indiana State University President Alan Rankin will be receiving honorary degrees during the Commencement ceremony. Those to be honored include Edward Fritz, retired president of the Chayse-Virginia Corporation, Doctor of Laws; Reverend Manfred Haas, retired Evansville minister, Doctor of Humanities; and D. Bailey Merrill, Evansville attorney, Doctor of Civil Law. President Rankin will be receiving the Doctor of Humanities degree.

**PRESIDENT FORD SENDS CONGRATULATIONS.** In a letter from President Ford sent to 1975 college graduates, President Ford addressed the graduates:

"You are graduating in a particularly difficult year. You will be faced with many uncertainties. But the opportunities that await you are even greater than the challenges. It will indeed be within your grasp to enlarge and enrich life in our society. As you make the decisions that will shape your course and that of your country, I hope you will keep in mind that one person can make a difference.

Times have changed greatly since I went to college. But looking back on those days in the context of today's world, I know that the same optimism and hope I shared with my classmates is very much alive in you today. I want you to know how much I admire your enthusiasm and determination, and how convinced I am that you will make a difference for America.

I wish each of you the satisfaction that comes from doing your best at something you believe in."
