A COLORFUL OPEN HOUSE IS PLANNED.

ISUE is inviting the community to visit the campus at its annual Fall Open House on Sunday, October 14, from noon to 3:00 p.m. Highlights of the day include student displays, concerts by the Mid-America Singers, apple butter cooking on the lawn, and the Sunday Buffet.

Several activities have been planned in academic areas and the Bent Twig Outdoor Education Center. Students will have displays on science, engineering technology, business, education, art, and allied health sciences. The day will also be an opportunity for interested parents to meet students' faculty and advisers.

If it is a nice, crisp autumn day as usual, visitors will enjoy a walk among the colorful trees in the Bent Twig Trails and tours of the log houses in the Outdoor Education Center. At the Eicher Barn, the Secretaries of ISUE will be making apple butter "the Old-fashioned way" in copper kettles over an open fire. Sales of the apple butter fund the group's scholarships each year.

The Mid-America Singers will perform in two concerts at 1:00 and 2:30 p.m. in Room A126, and special displays from the University's Archives will be on exhibit.

The hours of the weekly Sunday Buffet have been extended for Open House, with serving from 11:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. For this day, ISUE's Food Service Director prepares a buffet of several meats, vegetables, salads and desserts.

According to ISUE officials, the Open House, a day when all facilities are open to the public, is planned each year to coincide with the beginning of autumn, when trees on the 300-acre campus present a panorama of color.

GARTH MARSTON TO BE ISUE EXECUTIVE-IN-RESIDENCE. On October 15, Garth Marston, chairman of the board and chief executive officer of The Provident Institution for Savings in Boston, Massachusetts, will be ISUE's executive-in-residence.

Sponsored by the Division of Business, the Executive-In-Residence is an informal program designed to stimulate students' thinking and interaction with top level executives in business and industry.

Marston is a past chairman of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board and Federal Home Loan Mortgage Company. Prior to his association with The Provident Institution for Savings, Marston has served as chairman of the board and director of Bankers Data Processing, Inc. and Bay State Improvement Corporation of Boston, and director of the Value Exchange Corporation, Boston.

A graduate of the University of California at Berkeley and the Indiana University Savings and Loan Graduate School, Marston maintained his interest in higher education through service as secretary-treasurer and a member of the Board of Directors of the Higher Education Assistance Authority, State of Washington.

Marston will speak at a luncheon open to the public on October 15 from noon until 1:00 p.m. in UC350 on the topic "We're in the Real World." The deadline for registering is Thursday, October 11. The luncheon cost is \$4.00. For reservations contact the Division of Business at extension 1718.

NEW NIGHT ADDED TO ISUE MADRIGAL DINNER. The pomp and pageantry of an Elizabethan Christmas celebration will be brought to ISUE once again as the ISUE Mid-America Singers expand their presentation of the Madrigal Christmas Feast this year to December 6, 7, and 8.

The dinner, a ten-year tradition at ISUE, is an authentic reenactment of the kinds of feasts popular in Elizabethan and Tudor periods in England, and will include lively dances, traditional songs, and other theatrics performed by the Mid-America Singers and other members of the ISUE community.

According to MICHAEL JUDY, director of the Mid-America Singers and assistant professor of music, researching the time period was half the fun: "The cuisine, which includes the spiced, hot Wassail drink and the Flaming Plum Pudding, is as close to 16th century fare as possible. All of the costumes, also, are authentically Elizabethan in design, down to the last thread and positioning of each button and snap."

Other highlights of the evening will include music provided by a 24-member hand bell choir, the ISUE Brass Ensemble, harpsichord music, and 15th and 16th century selections performed by the Evansville Recorder Ensemble.

HUMANITIES FORUM. On Tuesday, October 16, Reverend Manfred Haas will celebrate Evansville's "rich German heritage in his lecture "Looking for the Roots of German-Americans" as part of the ISUE Humanities Forum series.

The lecture, which is scheduled from 12:30 to 2:00 p.m. in Room UC350, will focus on the influence German-American settlers had on the cultural life, industry, education and religion of Evansville.

"The German families wanted to retain their language and customs," says Rev. Haas, who performs a sermon in German each Christmas and Good Friday at St. Paul's United Church of Christ. His lecture will concentrate particularly on the 'Independece' and 'Lamasco' areas of the city and various German societies formed, such as the 'Liederkrantz' singing society and the Germania Mannerchor.
