> INDIANA NEWMAN STUDENT CONFERENCE. The Indiana Newman Student Conference, sponsored jointly by Campus Ministry at ISUE and UE, will be held Friday and Saturday, October 6 and 7 on the two campuses.

The two-day workshop on personal growth will revolve around the theme "Seeking Success in Life" and feature Father 3ob Kress, Professor at UE, as keynote speaker. Kress holds a doctorate in theology and masters degrees in philosophy and education. He studied at St. Meinrad Seminary, Notre

Dame University, Princeton University, Brown University, and at Innsbruck, Germany Paris, France and Rome, Italy. Kress, the author of four books and over eighty articles, is currently writing three books.

Pegistration takes place Friday, October 6 on the UE campus with the workshops being held Saturday, October 7 on the ISUE campus. Three major workshops have been scheduled dealing with eight personal growth topics. DR. HELEN SANDS, ISUE Associate Professor of Communications, will lead a workshop on communications entitled "Are You Really Coming Across." Helping coordinate the conference are FATHER BERNARD LUTZ and SISTER SHEILA GRIFFIN of the ISUE Campus Ministry.

TRIPS TO CHICAGO. The ISUE History Club has organized two trips to Chicago's Art Institute to view the "Pompeii 79 A.D." exhibit the weekends of October 13-15 and November 3-5.

The tours will include a visit to the University of Chicago's Oriental Institute Museum of Mesopotamian and Egyptian antiquities. The cost of the tour is \$35.00 per person and includes two nights lodging in the Pick-Congress Hotel in Chicago, transportation and entrance fee to the museum.

SPRING FIELD TRIP TO GERMANY. The ISUE German Club is planning a spring field trip to Munich, Germany April 12-April 22 during Easter Break and has opened the trip to the ISUE community.

According to club sponsor FREDERICKA WARD, Instructor in German, the group will fly from Chicago to Luxembourg City then travel by bus to the fourteenth century university city of Heidelberg, spend seven days in Munich adding a visit to Rothenburg ob der Tauber, a town that has remained virtually unchanged since the early middle ages.

Some of the tour highlights include excursions to seven of the world's most famous breweries and visits to three of the world's most outstanding art museums. Other attractions in Munich include a German history museum, a marionette museum, and a tour to the palace of the former royal family of Bavaria which includes a display of the crown jewels. Organized and impromptu side trips into the Bavarian countryside will take the group to the top of Germany's tallest mountain by cable car, to Oberammergau's village of wood carvers, to the fairy-tale castle of Neuschwanstein, and to the "Sound of Music" setting in Salzburg, Austria.
