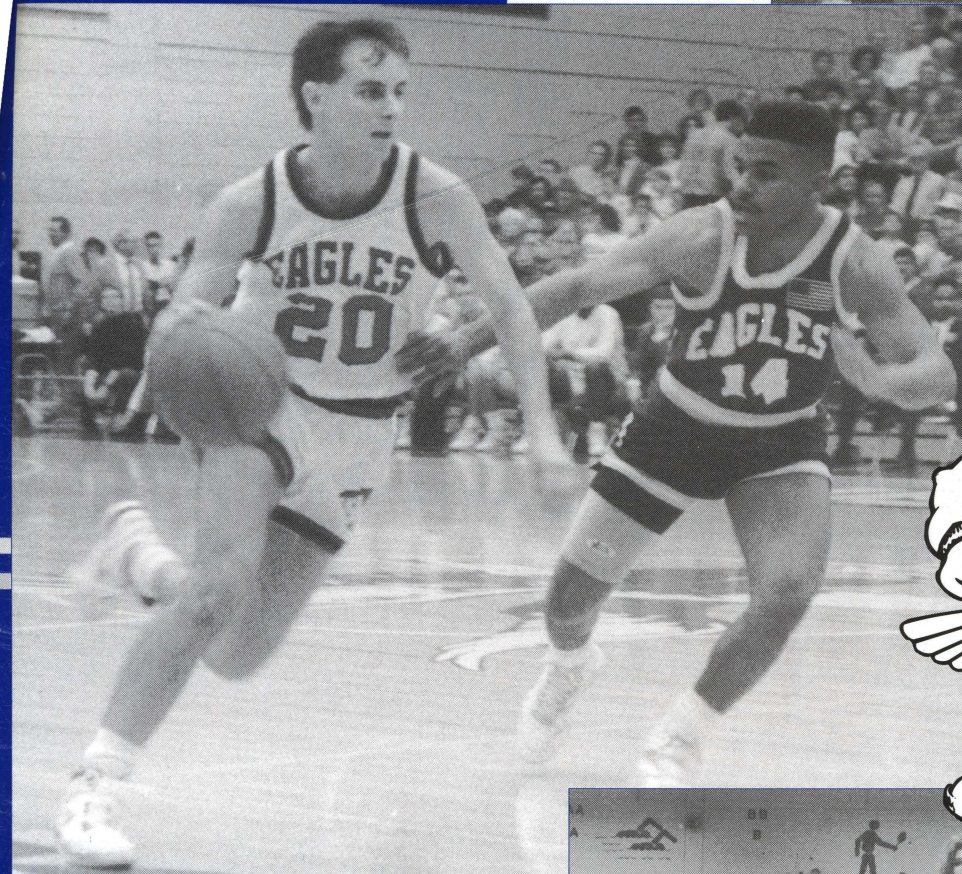
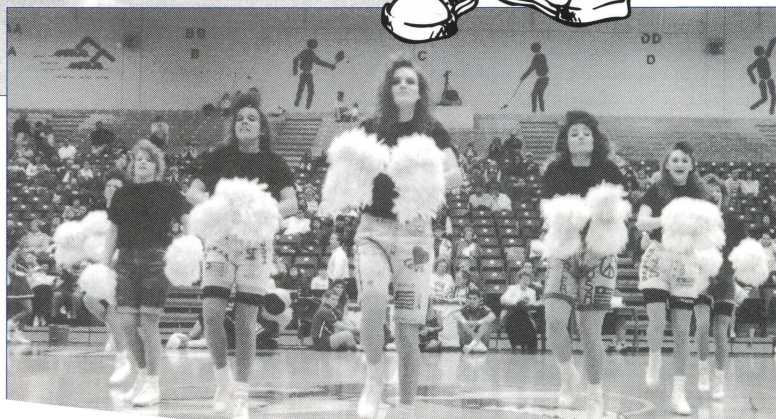

Coaches Hope To Shape Winning Season

Lionel Sinn and Chancellor Dugan know what it's like to be an author writing chapter one of a potential best seller.

Though each of the USI coaches has good material to work with, there's still a lot of writing to be done. If all goes well, the 1991-92 men and women's basketball seasons will show that writing the book is just as much fun as finishing it.

The Screaming Eagles, under the direction of fourth year coach Dr. Lionel Sinn, field a team with eight returning players and eight newcomers. USI returns the nucleus of its team with 6-10 junior Chris Bowles, last year's Great Lakes Valley Conference Newcomer-of-the-Year and honorable mention All-American.

Sinn knows that it may take a while for the fans to recognize the new faces on the court. "We're an unknown quantity, quite honestly. We have an unusually large number of new players, so much so that virtually three quarters of the team might be unrecognizable. Experience and knowing the demands of conference play, provides you with a great comfort zone, and we're certainly going to be looking to our returning players for that."

First year head coach Chancellor Dugan inherits a Women's Screaming Eagles team with ten new players and eight veterans. Coming into a program which has struggled in recent seasons, and now is confronted with the task of building from a vastly inexperienced team, Dugan says she isn't sure what to expect from this year's squad. But she is sure of one thing.

"We'll definitely be an exciting team to watch," said Dugan. "We're going to play a style that is fast paced and fun for both the players and the fans. I think people will be interested in our team."

Sinn expressed the hope that attendance for USI home games would continue to grow. "These athletes love to display their talents and hard work in front of a boisterous home crowd. They want to know that they are appreciated, and a good crowd can do that. That can be a very positive motivator for the players."

1991-92 MEN'S BASKETBALL

The Screaming Eagles men's basketball team will be restructuring in 1991-92.

The Eagles return one starter and two reserves from a team whose statistics include a 19-9 overall record, a 13-5 Great Lakes Valley Conference record, a fourth place finish in the GLVC (one game out of first), a defeat of the Big Ten's University of Wisconsin in Madison, Wis., 78-66, and a defeat of long-time rival Kentucky Wesleyan College in two of three games.

The 1991-92 Eagles will miss the leadership of players like Ilo Mutombo, who became USI's all-time leading rebounder and second all-time scorer, Dennis Humphrey, John Schellenberg, and Rick Stein. The departing Eagles from the 1990-91 squad made up a majority of the offense (66.9 percent) and rebounding (60.2 percent).

The Eagles return the center of the team in 6-10 junior forward/center Chris Bowles, who averaged 16.4 ppg (leading the team in 12 games) and 9.1 rpg (leading the Eagles on 13 occasions). He was named the GLVC Newcomer-of-the-Year, first team All-Great Lakes Region, All-GLVC and honorable mention All-American.

Returning at guard is 6-2 sophomore Craig Martin, who will be one of the players responsible for getting the ball to Bowles. As a freshman, Martin aver-

aged 6.0 ppg and 1.0 rpg in 27 appearances, starting four games.

Rejoining the team is 6-5 guard/forward Jeff Doyle, who only played in the first half of last season and averaged 2.3 ppg and 0.7 rpg in seven games.

Head Coach Lionel Sinn, who has a 55-32 record in three years at USI, said, "We have an excellent nucleus in Bowles, Martin, and Doyle. We expect them to lead and help in the development of the new team members.

"There is a 3-1 ratio of new players to returning players. The returning players will have to help teach our style of play and instill the pride of the program in the new players."

In the front court, the Eagles' new talent includes three transfers and a freshman. Todd Jones, a 6-7 sophomore forward, transferred to USI from Ball State University, where he was named to the Mid-America Conference All-Freshman team after averaging 4.0 ppg and 2.0 rpg. Also transferring to the Eagles is Jason Matthews, a 6-5 junior forward, who averaged 18.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, and 5.0 apg last season for Delaware Technology and Community College.

Garland Copeland, a 6-5 junior forward, returns to Evansville after two years at Olney Central Junior College. While at OCJC, he averaged 17.0 ppg and 10.0 rpg last season.

Neil Coyle is the new freshman front court player. A 6-8 forward from West Washington High School, he averaged 25.0 ppg and 10.0 rpg at WWHS.

To fill the middle, the Eagles will have 6-6 240 lb. junior center Duron Hebron, who transferred from Truman College, and 6-8 junior forward/center Troy Tornatta, who transferred from Wabash Valley College. Hebron averaged 20.0 ppg, 15.9 rpg, and was named All-Region last year.

At the guard position, USI has a good base to build upon with the return of Martin, and will depend heavily on two transfers and one freshman. Mike Allen, a 6-1 redshirt freshman who attended Western Illinois last season, aver-

aged 27.0 ppg and 5.0 apg at Shakamak High School (Jasonville, Ind.) in the 1989-90 season.

Joining Copeland in transferring from Olney Central is 6-3 guard/forward Mike Cheaney who averaged 6.0 ppg and 5.0 rpg last season. The new freshman guard is 6-2 Torrence Eddie, who averaged 15.0 ppg and 5.5 apg at Memphis East High School in Memphis, Tenn.

"We expect to be the best team we can be in February or March," said Sinn. "There is so much we have to teach. The new players need experience against our conference opponents. The key to this season and next will be in finding our identity, personality, and chemistry."

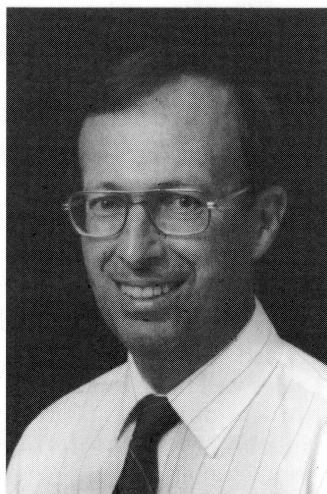


Screaming Eagles Coaches

HEAD COACH

DR. LIONEL SINN

Lionel Sinn enters his fourth season as head coach of the Screaming Eagles after leading the team to a 19-9 record last season. The 1990-91 accomplishments were highlighted by a victory over the Big Ten's University of Wisconsin and defeating long-time Great Lakes Valley Conference foe Kentucky Wesleyan College twice.



In 18 seasons at the collegiate level, Dr. Sinn has compiled a record of 327-190 with 16 winning seasons. He has led his teams to 19 or more victories ten times, including six seasons of 20 or more wins. In three seasons at USI, Coach Sinn has compiled a record of 55-32.

Prior to coming to USI, Dr. Sinn spent nine years at Northwest Missouri State University where he compiled a 165-90 record. He averaged more wins per season (18.3) than any coach in the school's history. While at Northwest, he led the Bearcats back to the national scene for the first time in 40 years, and they were nationally ranked eight of his nine seasons there.

Coach Sinn was named the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association Coach of the Year and Kodak NABC District Coach of the Year in the 1986-87 season.

Coach Sinn began his career as head coach at Bethel College in McKenzie, Tenn. He compiled the school's highest winning percentage with a 107-68 record and his teams were ranked in the top 20 of the NAIA national poll in four of his six seasons. He received the district Coach of the Year award in three of his six seasons there.

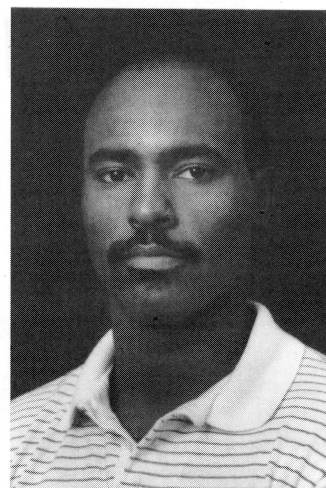
An Indiana native, Dr. Sinn earned the bachelor (with distinction), master (with honors), and doctorate degrees at Indiana University. While at Indiana, he was a graduate assistant to Indiana University's Bob Knight in the 1972-73 season when Indiana made it to the Final Four in St. Louis (UCLA, Memphis State, and Providence). He stresses the importance of education in athletics. Nearly 90 percent of his seniors have earned degrees.

Prior to coaching at the collegiate level, Dr. Sinn coached Indiana high school basketball for nine years.

ASSISTANT COACH

VIC COLEMAN

Vic Coleman enters his fourth season as assistant coach of the USI basketball team.



Coleman joined the USI staff after a six-year association with Coach Sinn at Northwest Missouri. Coleman played for four years at Northwest and was Coach Sinn's graduate assistant.

Coleman, a native of Danville, Va., is known for his recruiting ability. He likes to go one-on-one with potential recruits and share his playing and coaching experience with them.

The 29-year-old finished his four-year (1980-84) playing career as the Bearcats' leading scorer (1,795 points) and playmaker (467 assists). He was a two-time All-Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) first team (1982-83 and 1983-84) after leading the Bearcats in scoring both of those seasons, and he earned honorable mention All-American honors in 1984. Last season, Coleman became the first athlete at Northwest Missouri to have his jersey number retired.

Coleman was a tenth-round draft selection of the then Kansas City Kings in the summer of 1984 and was the last player cut from the rookie camp. He was the starting point-guard with the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) Kansas City Sizzlers during the 1985-86 season.

Chancellor Dugan enters her first season as the USI women's basketball coach and assistant athletic director.

Dugan comes to USI from Eastern Kentucky University where she has been the assistant women's basketball coach for the past two years. At EKU, she was responsible for coaching the post players and setting the defensive assignments. Prior to becoming the assistant coach at EKU, she was an assistant at Morehead State University and the University of Alabama.

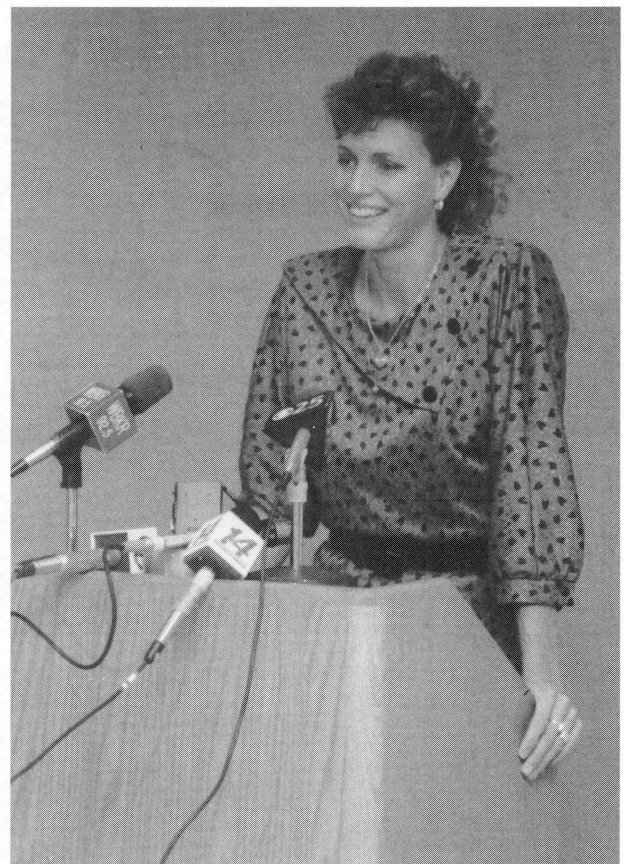
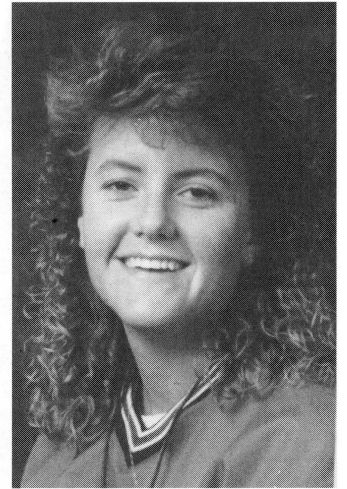

1991-92 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

"We want to open some eyes," says Head Coach Chancellor Dugan of the women's basketball team at the University of Southern Indiana. "We want the fans to know that the USI Lady Eagles are serious about basketball. We want to be contenders in the league and nationally."

Enthusiasm abounds for the Lady Eagles. Dugan explains, "On paper we have work to do on offense and defense, but looking at high school stats, the players have done the job before, so there are bright spots."

Eight team members are returning, and seven started during last year's season. "We are young and inexperienced, but returning players have been through the league before. It will take time to adjust to the new players and new system," said Dugan.

Two of the eight returning players are welcomed back from the sidelines. Returning from last year's team is Kathy Lauck, a 5-11 sophomore forward/center, who has improved her academic standing, and 5-6 sophomore guard Laura Perek, who recovered from a broken left hand in January.

Lauck, who played and started in 12 games before leaving the squad, averaged 14.7 points (ppg) and 9.5 rebounds (rpg) per game, while Perek, who was catching fire just before the injury, averaged 10.5 ppg and 3.8 rpg in 12 games, starting nine. In the six games before the injury,

Perek was averaging 14.2 ppg and 3.8 rpg, while shooting 44 percent from the field, compared to the first six games when she averaged 6.8 ppg and 3.8 rpg, while shooting 38 percent from the field.

A familiar face rejoining the Lady Eagles is 5-10 senior forward Shelly Scott. Scott, who sat out last season, was the team leader in the 1989-90 season averaging 15.9 ppg and 7.4 rpg in 28 games. Scott, who also holds 13 career, season, and game records, will help provide the leadership needed on the young team.

They are joined by four starters from last season. Leading the way is 5-10 sophomore forward Sheri Kaiser, who averaged 11.4 ppg and 6.3 rpg in 20 games, starting 15, last season after joining the team late due to a commitment to volleyball. Kaiser scored a season high 34 points against Indiana University Southeast and was named GLVC Player-of-the-Week for her efforts.

Also returning on the front line is 5-11 sophomore Kim Bechtel and 5-8 sophomore Sharon Gentry. Bechtel averaged 7.7 ppg and 4.7 rpg while playing in 27 games, starting 18. Gentry saw limited action in 11 games last year, averaging 1.1 ppg and 1.6 rpg.

In the back court, USI returns 5-6 sophomore guards Heidi Bullock and Sharie Sweet and 5-1 junior Angie Spaulding. Bullock, who played in all 28 games, averaged 7.9 ppg

and 4.3 rpg from the guard position, while Sweet averaged 7.2 ppg and 3.7 assists a game. Spaulding, who averaged 15 minutes a game in 26 appearances as the top guard off the bench, averaged 1.2 ppg, 1.3 rpg, and 1.2 assists.

Transferring to USI from Eastern Kentucky University are twins Annette and Jeanette Elkin, 5-11 sophomore forwards. Last season the twins saw limited action on a team heavy with upperclassmen, but A. Elkin averaged 1.0 ppg and 1.8 rpg and J. Elkin averaged 1.7 ppg and 1.0 rpg.

Also following from Richmond is freshman guard Glenna Bower. Bower was redshirted for basketball last season, but participated on the ECU cross country, indoor and outdoor track teams.

Bower was an outstanding high school player at New Washington (Ind.) High School. She set the Indiana State High School record for scoring average in a season with 35.5 ppg as a senior. Also at NWHS, Bower was named to the Hoosier Basketball magazine team, first team All-State, All-Conference (four

years), All-Sectional (three years) and played in the East/West Indiana All-Star game.

The Lady Eagles have two first-year players from Kentucky in Danielle Slaughter, a 5-9 forward from Henderson, and Stacy Roby, a 5-7 guard from Owensboro. Slaughter is the sixth all-time leading scorer and all-time assist leader at Henderson High School and Roby averaged 18.0 ppg and 5.0 rpg while being named honorable mention All-State last season at Owensboro Catholic High School.

Another transfer who gives the Lady Eagles depth in the front court is Jennifer Niethammer, a 6-2 center from Wabash Junior College. Niethammer played her freshman season with Indiana-Purdue Ft. Wayne and averaged 2.0 ppg and 1.0 rpg.

The Lady Eagles will begin the season with two juniors, nine sophomores and three freshmen. Dugan said, "We will be known for defense and an up-tempo style of basketball. The team will be competitive in the conference, with an ultimate goal of being
