BLEVINS NAMED TO INDIANA COMMITTEE FOR THE HUMANITIES (ICH). Dr. James Blevins, chairman of the division of humanities at ISUE, has been named to a three-year term on the Indiana Committee for the Humanities.

The ICH is a not-for-profit organization which awards grants to university and community groups to conduct public programs in history, philosophy, literature, and other fields of the humanities.

Dr. Blevins has distinguished himself in the Evansville community as a supporter of the arts and of the programs ICH sponsors. He has been a member of both the Board of the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra and the Board of the Evansville Museum. He is currently a member of the Board of the Evansville Arts and Education Council.

In 1972, he was the chairman of the Ohio River Art Festival, and he served as coordinator of musical activities for the Evansville Museum in 1975-76. He chaired major committees for public television in 1974 and 1976 and was a member of the Conductor Search committee of the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra in 1979. He is currently a member of the Board of Friends of Music of Indiana University.

In addition to his community activities, he has worked on ICH projects. In the spring of 1976, Dr. Blevins directed a successful project funded by ICH entitled "The American Experience on Film". He has also participated in ICH seminars and workshops in Evansville and French Lick.
