ISU BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEET IN EVANSVILLE

No fee increase for the students at the Evansville Campus of ISU was approved by the Indiana State University Board of Trustees at their monthly meeting held in Evansville on June 16, 1973.

A fee increase of \$2 per semester hour for Indiana residents and \$5 per semester hour for out-of-state residents was approved for the Terre Haute campus.

The current fees for ISUE will remain at \$620 per year for a full time Indiana resident. This figure includes the \$2.00 fee structure incorporated a year ago for the University Center. The ISUE Student Government had formally requested that the next fee increase be reserved for construction of a health, physical education, recreation building. The approved Evansville campus budgets totalled \$3,565,270 and included \$160,000 for building debt service.

Board President William L. Hitch of Princeton presided over the trustees' meeting at ISUE. Other board members attending were Mrs. Allen A. Mitchell, vice-president, Gary; James T. Morris, secretary, Indianapolis; Herbert I. Lamb, Terre Haute, assistant secretary; James D. Acher, Franklin; Rex E. Breeden, Columbus; and John E. McCutchan, Evansville.

The Board members approved a change of status for Byron Wright, vice-president for business affairs to vice-president for business affairs and assistant treasurer for the University. The contract for completion of the ISUE Library landscaping project was approved and awarded to McCarty's Colonial Garden Center of Evansville. The contract is for \$17,750.00.

The morning meeting adjourned and the members of the Board of Trustees enjoyed a picnic lunch in Westwood Lodge on the Evansville Campus. The structure was recently rennovated by the Westwood Garden Club and won recognition for the club in state competition. Westwood Lodge is located on a shaded cliff on east side of the campus.

#### ILLINOIS BASIN CHAPTER OF AMERICAN PETROLEUM INSTITUTE MAKES GRANT TO ISUE

A grant has been made by the Illinois Basin Chapter of the American Petroleum Institute to ISUE. The grant is to be used at the discretion of the geological department in support of the petroleum technology instruction now being offered at the school.

Ron Mitchell of Mitchell & Associates, Evansville, made the presentation to Dr. Frank Stanonis, Division Chairman of Science and Mathematics.

The API was established in 1919 as the first national trade association in the United States to encompass all branches of the petroleum industry. Within this framework, oil men and women today continue to work toward the advancement of the industry in the interest of the general public. One of the functions of the individual chapter of the API, which includes members in southern Indiana, Illinois, western Kentucky, and western Tennessee, is to assist and promote such endeavors as ISUE is undertaking.
