### EVANSVILLE - SUBJECT OF HUMANITIES FORUM.

The early history of Evansville and Vanderburgh county will be the subject of a lecture given by Dr. James Morlock on Tuesday, November 20 at ISUE.

The lecture, "Development and Settlement of Evansville and Vanderburgh County to 1840," is part of the ISUE Humanities Forum series of presentations and is scheduled from 12:30 to 2:00 p.m. in Room A28.

Morlock, whose book, The Evansville Story, treats the subject in depth, says that the lecture will deal largely with early Evansville history, including cultural and political events prior to the Civil War.

All Humanities Fourm events are free to the public.
