REVISION OF ACADEMIC TENURE POLICY. The Indiana State University Board of Trustees has adopted a policy extending the probationary period for full-time members of the faculty on tenure track appointments to seven years. This new policy is effective for individuals initially appointed after July 1, 1977.

The Indiana Higher Education Telecommunication System (IHETS) Board of Directors has allocated funds for extending the television network now provided exclusively to ISUE in the Evansville area via an Instructional Television Fixed Service (ITFS) transmission system which will be located on campus. In order to make this possible a microwave-link tower will be installed at the rear of the Technology Building. This tower will relay the TV signal from the reception dish atop the Science Center Building to the Old National Bank Building downtown. From there the signal will be "broadcast" to the area on a secure channel. Receive locations will then be established throughout the city wherever an IHETS converter is located. Primary sites are the city's three hospitals.

The tower itself will be a self-supportive (no guy-wires) tubular structure 120 feet high with a triangular base three to four feet wide on a side.

The television network operated by IHETS is much like a pipeline; consequently, it differs from the popular concept of a network.

Most television networks send one program at a time from a single distribution center to all reception sites. The IHETS network, however, is a "switched" system which makes possible simultaneous input from five different cities. That is, the video channels can be switched, or rearranged, to allow different paths for the programs. For instance, while one program goes from Bloomington to South Bend, another program can be going from Purdue to Evansville. Dozens of combinations are possible.

While most programs sent over the IHETS network are for specific classes or continuing education projects, some are generally available for use by any member institution.

Installation of the ITFS tower is expected to be completed during the month of June.

TETANUS TOXIOID IMMINIZATIONS. The University Health Service offers free tetanus toxioid boosters to all ISUE employees. The Vanderburgh County Public Health Department recommends that an adult receive the tetanus toxioid booster every three to five years. The only qualifications for receiving the booster from our health service are: 1. To have received an original D.P.T. series. 2. To have no known history of allergic reaction to tetanus immunizations.



2. SEATED TORSO TWIST

Tones and strengthens side waist muscles, improves flexibility and relieves muscle tightness and tension in low back region.

Sit upright in chair feet flat on floor and elbows raised to shoulder level at each side. Both arms should be well bent at elbows and kept reasonably relaxed. Begin by twisting as far around to right as you can go, then reverse twist as far as possible to left. Continue this action from side to side until you have done a total of 10 turns to each side. Start easily, but with each repetition try to twist around a little bit further. Be sure to turn your head in the same direction so, as you twist around, your eyes are looking directly behind you. Use moderate pace and avoid fast, jerky movements.
