ISSUE PROFESSOR RECEIVES GRANT. The Indiana Arts Commission awarded JOHN McNAUGHTON, associate professor of art, a crafts fellowship grant in the amount of \$2,500 for a year.

The purpose of the grant is to perpetuate an established Indiana artist's career. It allows an artist to have the maximum amount of freedom. McNAUGHTON plans to use the grant to purchase supplies such as exotic woods from all over the world and for the travel expenses of putting up displays and exhibitions. Since the grant began five weeks ago, he has created ten new pieces ranging from tables to bowls to boxes and has displays in Indianapolis and Chicago.

"It's the nicest kind of grant to get," McNAUGHTON says.

INCREASE IN BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD INSURANCE RATES. Effective July 10, 1980, Blue Cross - Blue Shield premium rates will be increased as a result of higher medical care costs and increased utilization of the program by covered University employees and their families. Staff members will continue to pay 25 percent of the cost, the University will contribute 75 percent of the cost. The employee's old and new share of monthly premium cost is as follows:

Staff members and spouses over age 65 are required to participate in the full Medicare program (Parts A and B). Effective July 1, 1980, the Medicare premium should be sent directly to the Social Security Administration.

Those staff members who continue working beyond age 65 will have 75 percent of the cost of the combined Medicare and University health insurance programs paid by the University. Since these individuals will pay their own Medicare premium, no further Blue Cross-Shield payment will be required. Following retirement, the monthly Blue Cross-Shield premium will be \$5.00 per month per person.

PEOPLE IN THE NEWS. DR. ANTHONY TILMANS, chairman of the Division of Engineering Technology, was recently appointed vice chairman of Region V (Michigan, Minnesota, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin) of the Technology Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology.
