The chairman of the Department of Business and Vocational Education at the University of North Dakota, Dr. John L. Rowe, will be the speaker at the second annual Indiana State University Evansville business education seminar on Saturday, October 14 at the Evansville Campus.

Dr. Rowe, a noted educator, lecturer and author, will lecture on how to teach typing. Eight teaching stations will be assembled with Dr. Rowe conducting the classes.

Dr. Rowe's formal education includes degrees from Wisconsin State University, State University of Iowa, and Teachers College, Columbia University. He has been affiliated with University of North Dakota for seventeen years and prior to that he was Professor of Business Education at Northern Illinois University.

A major authority in skills of typewriting, Dr. Rowe has authored and co-authored over thirty typewriting textbooks, including the popular Typing 300 for high schools. He has also compiled over 150 professional articles and research abstracts dealing with teacher education in shorthand, typewriting, basic business courses, student teaching, and vocational education.

Dr. Rowe has given lectures and demonstration to state, regional, and national professional meetings, to colleges

and universities, and to business organizations in forty-eight states. In 1968 Dr. Rowe conducted a world-wide lecture tour as a consultant in Business Education sponsored by the United States Government.

Dr. Rowe serves as associate editor of the 1973 Eastern Business Teachers Association Yearbook, Secretarial Education; member of the Board of Directors, Mountain Plains Regional Education Center; member of State Advisory Council for Vocational Education, representing post-secondary schools; and Vice-President of the American Vocational Association.

Dr. Rowe has been cited for his service to higher education in numerous awards, including being named Distinguished University Professor at University of North Carolina in 1966.

The business education seminar, sponsored by the Division of Business at Indiana State University Evansville, will begin at 9:30 a.m. on October 14. The seminar is open to business education teachers at the high school level, business education student teachers, and business education college students. Registration materials are available from Dr. Dona Frost, ISUE Associate Professor of Business and co-ordinator of the seminar. Student co-ordinator is ISUE senior business education major, Sandra Dennis.
