



CANONS AND MUSKETS ON THE ISUE CAMPUS.

On the weekend of July 4th, "Canons and Muskets on the Ohio," an authentic Civil War encampment-reenactment, will be held on the ISUE campus as part of the 1980 Freedom Festival.

The Battle of Richmond, Kentucky will be brought to life by reeanctors from all walks of life in authentic military uniforms. Major Joseph A. Malcolm, professor of military science at the

University of Tennessee, will narrate the battle and skirmishes.

According to Freedom Festival officials, on August 27, 1862, General Braxton Bragg, commander of "The Confederate Army of Tennessee," sent General E. Kiley Smith from northeastern Tennessee into Central Kentucky, with a small army of around 7,000 men. Advanced units of confederates were driven back as the Union forces prepared to defend Richmond. On August 30, General Smith attacked. After attack and counter-attack, the Union forces began to give way. They withdrew to form a new line of defense from which they were forced to retreat toward Louisville. General William "Bull" Nelson arrived to command the Union late in the battle.

The Confederate forces losses were few compared to the Union's.

OPEN ENROLLMENT FOR BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD. The Blue Cross Blue Shield group insurance program at ISUE provides that during the month of the policy anniversary date open enrollment is available to all eligible employees who have not previously enrolled.

Present members who are married and are carrying the single Blue Cross Blue Shield coverage, and now would like to include spouse and/or children in their coverage may do so during June to be effective July 10, 1980.

The cost is \$8.38 per month for single coverage; \$21.50 per month for family coverage. Full time faculty and staff members who wish to take advantage of this open enrollment opportunity should go to the Personnel Office, Room 101A, in the Administration Building to obtain the details and complete the enrollment form.

INCREASE IN BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD INSURANCE RATES: Effective July 10, 1980, Blue Cross-Blue Shield premium rates will be increased as a result of higher medical care costs and increased utilization of the program by covered University employees and their families. Staff members will continue to pay 25 percent of the cost; the University will contribute 75 percent of the cost. The old and new employees share of monthly premium cost is as follows:

*Individual rate per covered person in accordance with 1978 Amendments to Age Discrimination in Employment Act.

Staff members and spouses over age 65 are required to participate in the full Medicare program (Parts A and B). Effective July 1, 1980, the Medicare premium should be sent directly to the Social Security Administration.

Those staff members who continue working beyond age 65 will have 75 percent of the cost of the combined Medicare and University health insurance programs paid by the University. Since these individuals will pay their own Medicare premium, no further Blue Cross-Shield payment will be required. Following retirement, the monthly Blue Cross-Shield premium will be \$5.00 per month per person.

ISU FEDERAL CREDIT UNION, Due to the easing of the Federal Credit Restraint Policy, the ISUFCU Board held a special meeting on May 27, 1980 and voted to reduce the new vehicle loan rate back to 12%. Currently all 1979 and 1980 model vehicles which are pledged as security, are eligible for the 12% rate. The secured and open-end loan restrictions have been lifted.
