An Ohio State University political science professor who has written numerous articles and books on political campaigns and the presidency, will be a Community of Scholars lecturer on Wednesday, April 13, at the University of Southern Indiana.

Dr. John Howard Kessel will lecture on "Presidential Politics" at 7:30 pm. in Forum III. The program is sponsored by the USI Division of Social Science as part of the Community of Scholars program designed to broaden the scope of education beyond the classroom for students and make special presentations available to the public. Dr. Charles Barber, USI professor of political science, and Dr. Munir Quddus, assistant professor of economics, are in charge.

Dr. Kessel is the author of Presidential Campaign Politics: Coalition Strategies and Citizen Response, which was published in 1980 by Dorsey Press, Homewood, Illinois, and went into the third edition this year. He also wrote The Goldwater Coalition: Republican Strategies in 1964 (1968), The Domestic Presidency: Decision-Making in the White House (1975), and Presidential Parties (1984), as well as articles that have been published in American Political Science Review, American Journal of Political Science, Social Science Quarterly, Public Opinion Quarterly, and others.

Dr. Kessel formerly was president of the Midwest Political Science Association, editor of American Journal of Political Science, and a member of the executive council of American Political Science Association. A native Ohioan, he received his bachelor's degree from Ohio State in 1950 and his Ph.D. from Columbia University in 1958.
