## THE YANKEES ARE COMING TO ISUE!

Approximately 300 participants, wearing authentic uniforms and carrying authentic weapons, will help re-enact the Battle of Richmond, Kentucky at ISUE on July 4 through 6.

The original battle, which took place in late August 1862, was a Confederate victory. Of the 6,500 Union troops engaged, 5,200 were killed, wounded or missing. Total casualties for the 6,800 Confederate troops were 450.

The skirmishes and battle will be recreated in the area around Reflection Lake behind the Technology Building and University Center. Arthur Ayde of Evansville will narrate the action.

The Confederate forces will camp in the wooded area by ISUE's Westwood Lodge and Breckinridge Cabin, while the Union soldiers' site will be near the Paul Grimes Log Haus and the Eicher barn. Spectators are welcome to visit the encampments and observe the "soldiers" as they prepare meals, take care of their horses and pass the time between skirmishes.

ISUE's Sunday Buffet will be held as usual from 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. The balcony would give an excellent view of the encounters.

Authentic Civil War music will be presented by "The Troup," a five piece brass band consisting of professional musicians from Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

All of the weekend's events are open to the public at no charge, though spectators are asked to support the Freedom Festival by purchasing a button. The schedule of events will be as follows:

**TECHNOLOGY PROGRAMS ACCREDITED.** The Division of Engineering Technology has received word of the accreditation of their programs from the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology. The four associate degree programs - civil engineering technology, electrical engineering technology, mechanical engineering technology, and mining engineering technology - and the bachelor of science program in mining engineering technology were accredited.

The bachelor programs in civil, electrical and mechanical engineering technology have candidate status for accreditation because a program must be in existence four years before it can be accredited.
