University of Southern Indiana

1999 Men's Soccer Outlook

The University of Southern Indiana men's soccer team wants to surprise its opponents in 1999.

The Screaming Eagles have won more GLVC soccer titles than any other school: nine since 1979.

Fourth-year Head Coach **Scott Westbrook**, who has a 120-119-20 record in 14 seasons as a collegiate head coach, plans to start the Eagles off on the right track early in 1999, aiming for participation in the GLVC Tournament.

Westbrook has a solid corps of athletes who competed in the 1998 GLVC schedule and won the last two league contests. Five players return from the starting line-up, along with four additional letter winners who started games throughout the season.

The strength of the team will be in the midfield with junior **Derek Stull** (Ballwin, Missouri) and sophomore **Ed Pieper** (St. Louis, Missouri) to lead the way offensively. Stull and Pieper are the top returning scorers with six points each on two goals and two assists.

Pieper and Stull, who should become more dangerous offensively by playing a full season in the midfield, come back for the fall season with top reserves **Ryan Tucker** (Greenwood, Indiana), a junior outside midfielder, and **Matt Steinmetz** (Florissant, Missouri), a senior outside midfielder.

Tucker played in 16 of the team's 18 games, scoring one goal, while Matt Steinmetz had two goals in 18 matches. Matt Steinmetz

also played four games in goal for the Eagles and had a 1.59 GAA in 226 minutes between the posts.

Developing depth in the midfield, the Eagles have added two new faces. Joining his brother Tom Peroutka at the University is freshman **Brian Peroutka** (St. Louis, Missouri), who played for Vianney High School last year, while freshman **Josh Gregg** (Newburgh, Indiana) travels across Evansville to USI after playing for Castle High School in 1998.

For the Eagles to be successful, the squad will have to get the job done on the offensive end of the field.

After splitting time between different positions last year, junior forward **Tom Peroutka** (St. Louis, Missouri) and senior forward **Jason Steinmetz** (Florissant, Missouri) should help the USI offense by spending a full season in the offensive third.

To bolster the team offensively, the Eagles have assembled four freshmen forwards for the 1999 team. Westbrook tapped the regional high schools to bring in **John Havill** (Washington, Indiana), who played at Washington High School last year, and **Ryan Williams** (Greenfield, Indiana), who competed for Mt. Vernon High School in 1998.

Westbrook signed two players from Missouri in **Jeffery Dore** (Florissant, Missouri), who played for Hazelwood West High School, and **Wayne Wiseman** (St. Louis, Missouri), who was on the Clayton

High School soccer team.

A major project for Coach Westbrook during the off season has been rebuilding the USI defensive third after the graduation of captain Brian Cordia.

Leading the defenders this season is senior back **Dax Nightingale** (Houston, Texas). Nightingale was USI's starting sweeper through the first 12 matches last season before suffering a season ending injury.

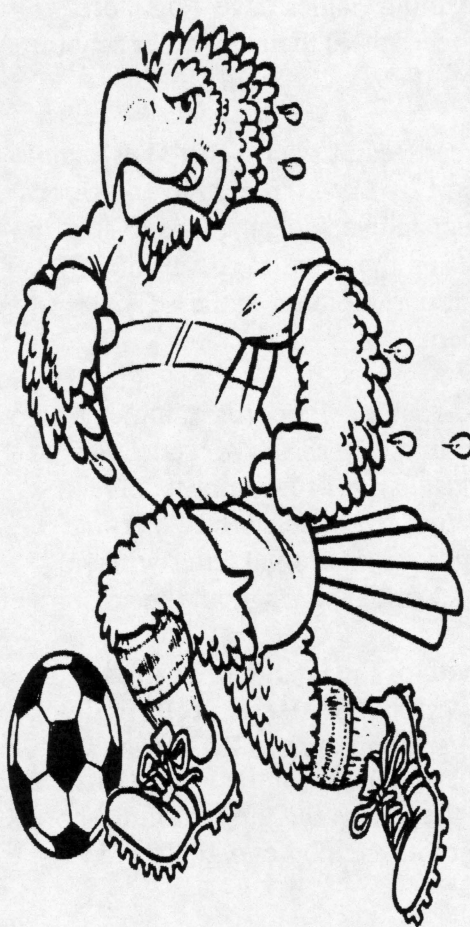
Nightingale, who is healthy and ready to return to his sweeper position, will be supported by sophomore back **Justin Wilson** (Washington, Indiana) and junior back/midfielder **J.T. Doane** (Bedford, Indiana), who played well off the bench in 1998.

Fortifying the USI defense is the addition of three freshmen to the backfield. They are **Nick Ingalls** (Greenfield, Indiana), who played at Mt. Vernon (Indiana) high school last year and **Justin Naber** (St. Louis, Missouri) and **Kevin Ray** (Ballwin, Missouri), who finished their prep careers at Vianney High School.

The battle for the goalkeeping spots should be very spirited during the preseason. Sophomore **Matt Miller** (Danville, Illinois) USI's only returning full-time keeper had a 2.97 goals against average, playing in just nine matches, starting in four.

Challenging Miller for the starting role and playing time will be four freshmen goalkeepers. Freshmen **Chris Davis** (Evansville, Indiana), **Ryan Mooney** (Newburgh, Indiana), and **David Gisler** (Carmel, Indiana), graduates of Castle High School, Castle High School, and Carmel High School, respectively, all look for playing time.

From beyond the Indiana border comes freshman goalkeeper **Lute Garber** (North Oaks, Minnesota). Garber played at Mounds View High School in Arden Hills, Minnesota, where he had 11 shutouts last fall.

Men's Soccer Head Coach

Scott Westbrook begins his fourth season at the helm of the Screaming Eagle men's soccer team.

Westbrook has led the USI club to a 16-36-2 record in three years. The Eagles have finished only one game out of a tournament appearance in all three seasons. This year, Westbrook plans on reversing that trend.

Westbrook, who has a 120-119-20 career record in 14 seasons as a college head coach, began coaching in 1985 at Lindenwood College in St. Charles, Missouri, leading them to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics playoffs in 1985 and 1987. Westbrook was named the Show Me Conference Coach of the Year in 1987.

In 1989, Westbrook moved to St. Louis, taking over the soccer team at Fontbonne College. During his tenure at Fontbonne, he led the squad into post-season play in 1989, 1990, 1991, and 1992, reaching the NCAA Division II Regional finals in 1991 and 1992.

In addition to the team's success, Westbrook was named the St. Louis Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1990, 1991, and 1992, and the Gatorade Mid-West Regional Coach of the Year in 1991.

Westbrook coached at the University of Arkansas-Little Rock in 1994 and 1995. Along with his coaching duties, Westbrook was the assistant compliance coordinator at UA-LR.

Westbrook earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from the University of Evansville in 1982 and a master's degree in business administration from Fontbonne in 1994. While a member of the soccer team at Evansville, he led the Aces to their first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division I tournament, was named to the All-Mideast Region team, and was selected for the Senior Bowl in 1982.

Following his graduation from Evansville, Westbrook played professionally between 1983 and 1985, in the indoor and outdoor leagues. He was selected 21st overall in the Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL) draft by the Wichita Wings in 1983 and was the team Rookie of the Year for the Detroit Express of the American Soccer League (ASL).

In addition to his coaching duties, Westbrook is also director of fifth-year aid and assists in NCAA compliance.
