



GRANT RECEIVED. The Division of Science and Mathematics at ISUE has recently received an Instructional Scientific Equipment Grant from the National Science Foundation for the acquisition of equipment to improve undergraduate instruction in cellular and molecular biology at the University. The grant was awarded to Marlene V. Shaw, Assistant Professor of Life Science.

According to *Dr. Shaw*, the grant will be used to obtain centrifugation, electrophoresis and spectrophotometry equipment. The equipment will make it possible to widen a student's practical experience with biological systems beyond the classical approaches of biology to include current methods of fractionating, identifying and quantitating cellular components. Such equipment will supplement existing equipment within the Division of Science and Math and permit laboratory experience in biological techniques consistent with current practices in clinical, industrial, and university laboratories.

Dr. Shaw joined the ISUE faculty three years ago. She received her doctorate degree in microbiology from the University of Illinois.
