GRANTS AVAILABLE. The Lilly Endowment has announced its Faculty Open Fellowships for 1980-81. The Endowment seeks to identify faculty of real ability whose aspirations and needs cannot be served by conventional fellowships for study and research. It hopes to find teachers/scholars in mid-career who may be in critical need of a break from academic routine and academic pressures, and who do not wish to spend the time on research.

Imaginative, unconventional proposals are encouraged.

Application forms are available from DR. ROBERT REID, vice president of academic affairs, and the completed application must be submitted to him by October 8.

The National Endowment for the Humanities 1980 summer stipend opportunities are available. Applications and information for the stipends can be picked up at the Humanities office, the Division of Social Science office or DR. REID's office. The application deadline is October 15, 1979.

CHRISTIAN DISCUSSION GROUP FORMING. A group of faculty and staff are beginning a lunchtime Christian discussion group. All faculty and staff are invited to the President's Suite of the cafeteria on Mondays at noon.
