Artist lecture and demonstration

Tennessee-based furniture maker and sculptor Craig Nutt will present a slide lecture at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, March 22, in Carter Hall. The lecture is free and open to the public.

Nutt is currently producing furniture with a vegetable theme. "Celery Chair with Carrots, Peppers and Sno Peas" is a functional chair with wood legs carved to resemble carrots and celery stalks, and a wood back resembling a peapod.

Nutt's work appears in many corporate, private, and museum collections including the Renwick Gallery at the National Museum of Art, Washington D.C.; the High Museum, Atlanta; and the Birmingham International Airport. He has received Artist Fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Tennessee Arts Council, and the Alabama State Arts Council.

On Tuesday, March 23, and Wednesday, March 24, Mr. Nutt will demonstrate furniture making on a work in progress from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the Technology Center, room 109. The demonstrations are free and open to the public.
