The candidates will field questions from a panel representing students, faculty and the media. Serving on the panel will be MIKE SIMMONS, vice president of SGA; DR. WALTER HOPKINS, associate professor of sociology; Alice Jackson, assistant news director of WGBF radio; and Dale McConaughay, reporter for The Evansville Press. ROBERT BARNES, president of SGA, will moderate the session. HUMANITIES FORUM PRESENTATIONS. Mr. John Richardson, art historian on the faculty of Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville, will present a slide lecture "Underground Comix as Art" Thursday, October 26 at 1:00 p.m. in A126.

Richardson received the Bachelor of Arts in painting/drawing and English literature from Eastern Washington State College and the Master of Art in art history, with emphasis on the theory of education, from Columbia University. He was awarded the

HUMANITIES FORUM PRESENTATIONS (con) doctorate in higher education and art history from Columbia University and has also studied at Stanford University and Pratt Institute.

Before joining Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville in 1959, Richardson taught at Fresno State College and the State University of New York. He has worked as a technical illustrator, a free-lance commercial artist, and has originated comic strips for underground presses.

Richardson is the author of three books, Modern Art and Scientific Thought, Art: The Way It Is, and the Complete Book of Cartooning, and has had numerous articles published in professional journals.

OPEN ENROLLMENT FOR BLUE CROSS/BLUE SHIELD. The Blue Cross/Blue Shield group insurance program at ISUE provides that once each year during the month of November an open enrollment period is made available to all eligible employees who have not previously enrolled.

Present members who are married and are carrying the single Blue Cross/Blue Shield plan but did not elect to include spouse and/or children on the original application, may do so during November with coverage to become effective on December 10. The next opportunity to add your dependents will be July, 1979.

The cost is \$6.50 per month for single coverage or \$18.00 per month for family coverage. If you begin payment by payroll deduction, the effective date of your insurance coverage may be December 10, 1978.
