USI ENROLLMENT CONTINUES RECORD-SETTING TREND. Enrollment increased 8.5 percent this fall, bringing the total number of students to 5,713 compared to 1988 fall enrollment of 5,265. There are 3,312 full-time students, up 8 percent, and 2,401 part-time students, up 9 percent. The number of women students, as a percentage of the student body, also continued an upward trend. There are 3,533 women and 2,180 men enrolled; women now comprise 62 percent of the enrollment. There was a slight gain in the number of black students, from 124 to 132. Thirty-five percent of USI's enrollment is over age 25, about the same as last year.

The enrollment by class standing is 2,419 freshmen, 1,003 sophomores, 812 juniors, 817 seniors, 60 graduate students, and 602 special undergraduates, a classification established in 1986 to include students who are not seeking a degree or who are enrolled in special courses of study which do not necessarily lead to a degree. Students enrolled in the MBA program offered jointly by USI and the University of Evansville are not included in these figures.

SIHE ENDOWS ROBERT L. KOCH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP. Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc., (SIHE) has approved a contribution of \$15,000 to endow a **Robert L. Koch Memorial Scholarship** at USI, honoring the Evansville business and civic leader who died August 22. Mr. Koch, chairman of the board of George Koch Sons, Inc., had been a leader of SIHE since its beginning and helped to establish the University in 1965. He led the SIHE community fund drive which raised nearly a million dollars to purchase land for the University. **Mrs. Suzanne A. Nicholson**, president of the USI Foundation, said memorial contributions which

have been received for Mr. Koch will be added to the endowment fund. Any other donations honoring Mr. Koch will be welcome, she said, and will be added to the fund. Proceeds from the endowment will be used to confer annual scholarships in Mr. Koch's name. The endowment was approved at a recent SIHE Board meeting in which **Mr. Robert L. Koch II**, president of George Koch Sons, Inc., was named to succeed his late father on the SIHE board.

NAMES IN THE NEWS. Dr. Robert E. Gehring, associate professor of psychology, completed a summer research project in San Diego that was sponsored by the American Society for Engineering Education and the U.S. Navy. He reviewed previous research on the use of diagrams to increase learning from self-study books. Naval training materials were rewritten to incorporate principles known to work from scientific study or believed to work in training programs. Testing on Navy personnel showed improved learning efficiency of 56 percent. Results will be presented first in a U.S. government publication, and follow-up studies will analyze principles used individually to determine the relative contribution of each to learning efficiency.
