MID AMERICA SINGERS TO PERFORM ON WTVW-TV DECEMBER 22. The Mid America Singers of ISUE will be performing Monday, December 22, on the WTVW-TV Christmas special "Christmas Close to Home".

Known throughout the tri-state for their upbeat music and lively choreography, the Mid America Singers are a select group of ISUE students who must audition for membership. The group was formed in Fall 1969 with eight singers and one accompanist. Under the

direction of Willard Kesling, the group has grown to 31 students this year. In addition to performing throughout the area, the Mid America Singers entertain at ISUE madrigal dinners each year.

The Mid America Singers travel frequently throughout Indiana, Illinois, and Ohio and in 1974 made a tour of the Hawaiian Islands. They also performed at Florida's Disneyworld. In their short history, the Mid America Singers have compiled an impressive record, performing for television and live audiences.

Kesling came to ISUE this year from Walters State Community College in Morristown, Tennessee, where he was head of the music department. The Maryland native is a graduate of Lynchburg College in Lynchburg, Virginia and the University of Oklahoma. He is a former director of the Naval Air Training Command Choir and is currently a Ph.D. candidate at the University of Oklahoma. In addition to his work with the Mid America Singers, he directs the Evansville Philharmonic Chorus.

Kesling says he feels good about the progress of the Mid America Singers this year and has had many comments about the quality of their programs. "I have tried to emphasize singing more than choreography this year and I hope the improvements in our music will be evident to viewers of the Christmas Close to Home special," he commented.

"I am delighted that we had the opportunity to work with Channel 7 in producing this program of music especially designed for Tri-state viewers," he said.

In addition to the television special for WTVW-TV, the Mid America Singers will also be performing at the governor's inauguration on January 12, at noon, Evansville time.
