The ISUE College Panhellenic is composed of four social sororities. The representatives to the ISUE panhellenic are Lana Gee, senior business education major, 3111 Arlington, of Alpha Sigma Alpha; Phi Beta Chi representative, Debbie Downen, sophomore business major of 705 N. Bell Avenue; Sigma Kappa representative Rhonda Endsley, junior elementary education major of 2215 Venetian Drive and Angie Folz, freshman Spanish major of 3600 Kech Avenue representing Sigma Sigma Sigma. Mrs. Cecelia Little, Instructor in Allied Health, and Administrative Assistant for Student Services is the advisor for the ISUE College Panhellenic.

The National Panhellenic Conference is a conference of women's private social sororities having undergraduate chapters in accredited colleges and universities. The conference is a policy making body for social sororities. The conference began in 1902 with 187 chapters and had grown by June of 1955 to 1,778 collegiate chapters in 244 accredited colleges. Today there are 2,260 collegiate chapters in 341 colleges with a membership of 1,250,000 women.
