Ms. Granet received her B.F.A. at the Tyler School of Art in Chicago and has since lived and worked in New York while supporting herself as a sign painter. This employment, as well as the influence of deconstruction and semiotics, is evident in her work, addressing issues of sexual harassment, child and domestic abuse, women's choice, nuclear power, and the environment. Her most recent paintings appropriate the visual style of Wedgewood pottery, depicting humorous narratives concerning issues of class, power, and wealth in contemporary American culture. Her work is represented by P.P.O.W. Gallery in New York, and appears in numerous corporate, private, and museum collections.
