**WALK-JOG-RUN FOR HEART.** The third annual "Walk-Jog-Run for Heart" will begin at 10:00 a.m. Saturday, November 10 on the grounds of ISUE.

Registration for the event, sponsored by the American Heart Association and the University of Evansville Track Team, will be from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. at the ISUE campus. Participants are asked to obtain sponsors willing to pledge a specified amount of money toward each mile completed.

An added activity this year will be the road race for running enthusiasts beginning at 9:00 a.m. The entry fee for the road race is \$5.00 per runner and each participant will receive an official Walk-Jog-Run tee shirt.

Also, this year marks the beginning of something new in terms of organizational participation. Three competitive categories have been established: the three local hospitals, the area high schools, and the various organizations of both the University of Evansville and the Indiana State University Evansville campuses. Traveling trophies will be awarded to the representative in each division who raises the largest amount of money. If an organization or institution wins the trophy for three consecutive years, it will be permanently awarded to them.

All participants are eligible for prizes determined by the amount of money they collect. A 19-inch color television set will be given to the top fund raiser, a certificate for a frozen turkey to each person turning in \$75.00 or more, an official race tee shirt for those contributing \$10.00 or more, and an American Heart Association frisbee to those contributing \$5.00.

Sponsor sheets are available for local banks, merchants and Heart Association board members. Only one prize, other than the frisbee, shall be awarded to any one participant.

Proceeds from the event will benefit the Southwest Division of the American Heart Association, which combats heart disease, the nation's No. 1 killer, through research, professional and public health education and community health programs.

Rain date for the event is November 17.

**BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND.** The ISUE German Club is planning another trip to Germany May 17 through 30, 1980.

The fifteen-day educational trip will include visits to Cologne, the Black Forest, Munich, a castle in the Alpine highlands, Ravensburg, Trier, and other beautiful places. Sightseeing, shopping, and individual exploring is planned.

Because of fixed prices, such as the charter bus, the trip price will be reduced if there are more participants. With twenty participants the cost per person will be \$976.00, with twenty-five -- \$926.00, with thirty -- \$907.00, and with thirty-five -- \$886.00. There will be a discount to ISUE students who are members of the German Club. A deposit of \$50.00 is due by December 1, 1979. It will be refundable in full until January 1, 1980, but after that time deductions may have to be taken out for deposits made to airlines, etc.
