



ISUE TORNADO DRILL TODAY. On Wednesday, March 10, ISUE will participate in the National Weather Service Tornado Drill sponsored by Civil Defense. Guidelines on what to do in case of a Tornado Alert will be distributed.

To test the communication system, an alert will be staged. Starting at approximately 10:00 a.m. each area will be notified by

the Office of Safety and Security to go to their assigned area as follows:

ADMINISTRATION BUILDING: Occupants will move to the lower area of A126 Blue Lecture Hall.

LECTURE HALLS A34 & A28: Occupants will move to the hallways near the vending machines away from outside windows.

CLASSROOM BUILDING: Occupants will move to the inner hallway on the lower level. As many persons as possible should stay to the north side hallway. The inner labs may be used if necessary.

ART STUDIOS 1&11: Occupants will move to the basement of Studio One (Kinder Haus) away from windows and remain low to the floor.

CHILDREN'S CENTER AND CLASSROOM ANNEX: Occupants should move to the lower level of the University Center through the back door at the loading dock. Every effort will be made to provide help with the children by the staff of the Physical Plant Department.

MEDICAL EDUCATION BUILDING: Occupants should move to the Physical Plant tunnel.

UNIVERSITY CENTER: Occupants should move to the lower level away from windows.

LIBRARY: Occupants should move to the lower level hallways away from windows.

TECHNOLOGY CENTER: Occupants should move to the lower level away from windows.

SPRING SCHEDULE OF SHROUD LECTURES. DR. DANIEL SCAVONE, professor of history, will give his popular presentation on "The Shroud of Turin," at several area locations this spring.

SCAVONE, who has traveled extensively in Greece, Italy, Turkey and the western Mediterranean, was one of the few Americans invited to attend an international conference in Turin in 1978, which convened to perform scientific tests on the shroud.

The shroud is a 13-foot length of linen which contains an image of a human body with clear evidence of crucifixion. Scientists are baffled as to how the image could have been formed. The shroud, which has been dated as more than 19 centuries old, has been linked with the crucifixion of Jesus.
