JARMAN RETURNS TO ISSUE FOR POETRY READING. On Wednesday, January 16, ISSUE will open its Humanities Forum series of presentations for the spring of 1980 with a poetry reading by former ISSUE creative writing instructor Mark Jarman.

Jarman, who spent the last year writing in Italy with the aid of a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts committee, now teaches poetry writing at the University of California at Irvine as their Visiting Poet-in-Residence.

Jarman's work has appeared in major literary journals, including the North American Review, Paris Review, and Antioch Review, and a volume of his poetry, North Sea, was published a year ago by the Cleveland State University Press.

The reading, which is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. in Room 350 of the University Center, is free and the public is invited to attend.
